

William A. Smith

William Smith is Vice-President of Public Policy for the Sexuality Information and Education Council of the United States or SIECUS. In this capacity, he heads up SIECUS's public policy and advocacy efforts in the areas of sexual and reproductive health at the international, federal, state and local levels. Based in Washington, DC, Mr. Smith conducts policy maker education in the United States Congress and the Executive Branch and oversees a staff that does similar work internationally and in many states and communities. Mr. Smith also writes extensively and speaks on many issues related to politics and reproductive and sexual health policy.

Prior to joining SIECUS in February of 2000, Mr. Smith was Manager of the Religion and Public Values Program at The National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy. At the National Campaign, Mr. Smith was responsible for launching an innovative community-based model to overcome conflict around teen sexuality and served as a member of the Campaign's field staff, providing consultation and technical assistance in dozens of communities across the country.

Mr. Smith holds an undergraduate degree from Elizabethtown College in Pennsylvania and has done graduate work in politics at Villanova University, Georgetown University and the University of Notre Dame. He is currently completing his doctorate in political philosophy at The Catholic University of America.
