Situation Overview

- Seismic activity at La Soufrière, St Vincent has remained low since the tremor associated with the explosion and ash venting on April 22, 2021.
- The Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines has lowered the volcanic alert level at La Soufrière to ORANGE on May 6, 2021, based on recommendation from The University of the West Indies Seismic Research Centre (UWI-SRC).
- On August 17, 2021, the Prime Minister, Dr. Ralph Gonsalves announced residents above Rabacca, as far as Owia, could return to their homes as of August 23, 2021.

Health Situation

- The Ministry of Health (MOH) announced on August 6, 2021, that the COVID-19 Delta Variant had been identified.
- The MOH announced on September 7, 2021 that the COVID-19 Mu Variant has been identified in samples collected between July 19, 2021 and August 9, 2021.
- The MOH announced on September 12, 2021 that the Gamma variant of concern (VOC) P.1 was detected in one sample collected on August 14, 2021.
- The EWARS pilot by MOH will be conducted in Modern Medical & Diagnostic Center (Georgetown District), Stubbs Polyclinic (Calliaqua District) and Buccament Polyclinic (Pembroke District). The date of the pilot is pending by MOH.
- Three clinics remain closed: Fancy Clinic, Owia Clinic, and Sandy Bay Clinic. All other health clinics and hospitals have re-opened for services.

PAHO Response Actions

Health Coordination/Logistics/General Assistance

- PAHO supported the ash cleaning projects at Chateaubelair Clinic and Evesham Health Center.
- Air Quality monitoring project which received MOH approval is scheduled for September 17th -24th, 2021.
 The air quality monitoring site identification for the installation of equipment includes the following five locations in St. Vincent and the Grenadines:
 - NEMO Headquarters
 - Belmont Observatory at Rose Hall
 - Modern Medical and Diagnostic Centre in Georgetown
 - South Rivers VINLEC power station
 - Fair Hall Primary School

Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MPHSS)

PAHO partnered with MOH to produce a jingle for use in asocial media campaign.

Non-communicable Diseases (NCD)

- The non-cold chain portion of the three NCD kits donated by WHO have been delivered to St. Vincent and the Grenadines. PAHO is planning the NCD Refresher Training in conjunction with the MOH.
- Nutrition: PAHO collaborated with MOH to adapt and develop 10 educational social media cards. These
 cards are aimed at educating members of the community visiting select social media sites on the preparation and consumption of health foods.

Water, Sanitation and Health (WASH)

 PAHO is set to begin conducting WASH interventions as identified by MOH in consultation with PAHO WASH expert in 20 health facilities located throughout St. Vincent and the Grenadines as part of the grant awards from ECHO, USAID and PAHO. The 20 clinics selected by MOH are:
