Context: Cancer is among the leading causes of death in children under the age of 15 years. In high-income countries, pediatric cancer mortality has been reduced significantly, as a result of earlier diagnosis and effective treatment, and survival rates are 80% or higher. Yet in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC), pediatric cancer mortality continues to be high and survival rates significantly lower than high-income countries. As a result, there is increasing interest in the global health community to develop strategies to improve early diagnosis and treatment in LAC, to decrease pediatric cancer mortality and reduce the gaps in outcomes. There is also a need to complete information on the pediatric cancer situation and the health system response in LAC, to inform the development of feasible and sustainable strategies. Therefore, the Pan American Health Organization has formed a working group on pediatric cancer, and in collaboration with the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC), Sick Kids Hospital, and the University of Chile, an analysis is being conducted on how pediatric cancer care is currently delivered, funded and organized in LAC. This working group was initiated in November 2016 and the information collection phase of the analysis is currently in process. The working group will have its first face to face meeting on February 2-3, 2017 to review and discuss the regional analysis, and begin to discuss strategies to improve pediatric cancer in the Region.

Purpose:

- 1. Discuss information available and needed to complete the regional analysis on pediatric cancer care in LAC.
- 2. Identify key elements within the health care system that need strengthening to improve pediatric cancer in LAC.
- 3. Begin to develop recommendations for countries, and collaborating institutions, on how pediatric cancer care can be improved in LAC.
