

## SURPRISING ALCOHOL PATTERNS OF CONSUMPTION AMONG BOYS AND GIRLS

Alcohol is no longer a thing for men. In fact, girls reported to have more access to alcohol than boys in Colombia, St. Vincent, Trinidad and Chile.

#### ★ What does Ecuador say?

Three elements have contributed to lower rates of alcohol consumption among our youth, especially in Quito city.

1. The Ministry of Health is promoting, since 2006, the program *managing the drinker problem program* by training professionals in the Health Areas as well as young students and community leaders.


