Global School-based Student Health Survey

Guatemala (Capital City Oficial) 2009 Fact Sheet



The **2009 Guatemala (Capital City Oficial) GSHS** measured alcohol use; dietary behaviors; hygiene; mental health; physical activity; and sexual behaviors.

The 2009 Guatemala (Capital City Oficial) GSHS was a school-based survey of students in grades primero, segundo, and tercero basico. A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce data representative of all students in grades primero, segundo, and tercero basico in Guatemala (Capital City Oficial). At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 100%, the student response rate was 86%, and the overall response rate was 86%. A total of 2159 students participated in the Guatemala (Capital City Oficial) GSHS. Students self-reported their responses to each question on a computer scannable answer sheet. For comparison purposes, only students aged 13- 15 years are included in the analyses for this fact sheet.
