The main objectives of this Unit are to strengthen the countries' capacity to develop mental health policies, plans, programs, and services; formulate public policies for the control of alcohol abuse; prevent disabilities and achieve equal opportunities for people with disabilities; and promote and protect the human rights advances in the promotion and protection of the human rights of people with mental illness.

Designation of the New Unit Chief of the Mental Health & Specialized Programs of PAHO/WHO and the New Sub-regional Adviser on Mental Health for Central America and the Spanish-Speaking Caribbean.

We are please to announce that Dr. Jorge Rodríguez has been appointed as the new Unit Chief of the Mental Health & Specialized Programs of PAHO/WHO, effective 18 September 2006.

Dr. Rodríguez, up to now Sub-regional Adviser on Mental Health for Central America, Mexico, and the Spanish-speaking Caribbean, was named after competing with other candidates with excellent credentials for the post. Dr. Rodríguez has had an extensive professional and academic career in psychiatry in Cuba, a fruitful career in international mental health that began in Africa, continued in UNICEF, and more recently, at PAHO. Dr. Rodríguez has a lengthy list of publications, based on his social psychiatric research —among them, a book soon to be published on mental health in disasters.

His appointment concludes the interim assignment of Dr. Itzhak Levav, who has held this post since Dr. José Caldas de Almeida returned to his home country in November 2005. Dr. Rodríguez will be succeeded by Dr. Victor Aparicio Basaurí as Sub-regional Adviser on Mental Health for Central America, Mexico, and the Spanish-speaking Caribbean, effective 1 October 2006.
