Priorities to Reduce Impaired Driving Among USA Latin Communities

The Regional Advisor on Alcohol and Substance Abuse of the Pan American Health Organization, Maristela G. Monteiro, MD, PhD, participated in the Meeting organized by these two prestigious institutions, whose objective was to discuss and promote effective strategies for reducing impaired driving traffic fatalities and injuries among Latin American populations in the USA. Participants shared and discussed the latest data and research studies which show why this should be a problem of particular concern to all social actors these days.

The new NHTSA initiative prioritizes three areas: high visibility enforcement, support for prosecutors and DWI courts, and alcohol screening and brief intervention in emergency departments and other settings. The meeting recommended ways of translating these priorities into programs effective for Latin populations as well.

The Latin Community constitutes the largest minority group in the United States, -it has grown over 60% in the last 10 years-, and is expected to reach 59 million people in 2030. As a result of this impressive population growth, the Latins are being noticed for their consumption patterns and are being labeled by some domestic brewers as one of "the hottest emerging markets". This will result in a greater exposure of Latin American groups to advertising, which at present is 5 times larger when compared with other communities.

Regarding consumption, Latin men consume more alcohol than men belonging to other communities and they believe that the number of drinks needed to affect driving is generally higher (4 to 8 drinks). Moreover, 56% of students in grades 5 through 12, say that alcohol advertising encourages them to drink and Latin young people are likely to drink and to get drunk at an earlier age.

As to the consequences, Latin women suffer three times as many social consequences from drinking than other communities. Men are more likely to die from cirrhosis of the liver and have a higher prevalence of contracting Hepatitis C; more than 40% of those who begin drinking before 13 will develop an addiction and alcohol dependency associated with alcohol use at some point in their lives. Alcohol use contributes to the three leading causes of death among Latinos ages 12-20, which are unintentional injuries –including car crashes-, homicide and suicide. In fact, motor vehicle crashes (due to alcohol consumption) are the leading cause of death among Latinos between the ages of 1 and 44.
