## Summary of the cumentsituation

As of 17 J une 2009, 35,399 confirmed cases of the new virus influenza A (H1N1) infection, including $\mathbf{1 8 0}$ deaths, have been notified in $\mathbf{2 7}$ countries of the Americas: Argentina, Bahamas, Barbados, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Jamaica, Mexico, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Panama, Peru, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, United States, Uruguay a nd Venezuela. WHO is not recommending any travel restrictions related to the outbreak of the Influenza A (H1N1) virus.

In the Americas Region, there were $\mathbf{2 , 7 3 6}$ additional confimed cases compared to previous day. Suriname notified it's first's cases caused by the new influenza $A$ (H1N1) virus.

The following overseas teritories have confirmed cases of influenza A (H1N1): Bermuda, UK Overseas Temitory (1); Cayman Islands, UK Overseas Temitory (4); British Virgin Islands, UK Overseas Teritory (1); Martinique, French Overseas Community (1); Curaçao, Dutch Overseas Teritory (3); and Saint Maarten, Dutch Overseas Te mitory (1).
