West Nile Virus (WNV) in the USA and Canada

USA, 27 August 2003: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta reported 1,482 cases and 24 deaths from West Nile Virus. The most affected state has been Colorado, with 635 cases (43% of the total) and 6 deaths (25% of the total), followed by South Dakota with 206 cases (14%) and 2 deaths (8%) and Nebraska with 190 cases (13%) and 4 deaths (17%). To date, detailed information is available on 790 cases, of which 356 (45%) were classified as mild forms of the disease, 319 (40%) were classified as serious forms—encephalitis or meningitis—and 115 (15%) were not clinically classified. Canadá, 27 August 2003: Nine confirmed cases of West Nile Virus infection have been reported. The province most affected has been Saskatchewan, with seven confirmed cases.
