Brazil (Rio de Janeiro) - Nursing Students (3<sup>rd</sup> Year Students Only) Global Health Professions Student Survey (GHPSS)

FACT SHEET .

The Brazil (Rio de Janeiro) nursing students GHPSS includes data on prevalence of cigarette smoking and use of other tobacco products, knowledge and attitudes about tobacco use, exposure to second-hand smoke, desire for smoking cessation, and training received during nursing school regarding patient counseling on smoking cessation techniques. This information could be very useful in monitoring and developing Brazil (Rio de Janeiro)'s comprehensive tobacco control program.

The Brazil (Rio de Janeiro) nursing students GHPSS was a sample of  $3^{rd}$  year nursing students attending the 10 nursing schools in Brazil (Rio de Janeiro) conducted in 2006. The school response rate was 90.0% and the student response rate was 76.4%. A total of 954 students participated in the Brazil (Rio de Janeiro) nursing students GHPSS.

Highlights
Over 1 in 10 currently smoke cigarettes and 4.0% currently use other tobacco products.
More than 4 in 5 smokers indicated that they want to quit.
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Four in 5 were exposed to smoke in public places.
Close to 3 in 10 received training to provide patients with cessation approaches.
Over 9 in 10 think health
professionals should get specific training on
cessation techniques to use with patients.
