Information for Persons Intending to Travel to South Africa to Attend the FIFA World Cup

Travelers' Information for South Africa

Yellow Fever

Country requirement: a yellow fever vaccination certificate is required from travellers over 1 year of age coming from countries with risk of Bellow fever transmission.

Yellow fever vaccine recommendation: None

Malaria

Malaria risk due predominantly to *P. falciparum* exists throughout the year in the low-altitude areas of Mpumalanga Province (including the Kruger National Park), Northern Province and north-eastern KwaZulu-Natal as far south as the Tugela River. Risk is highest from October to May. Resistance to chloroquine and sulfadoxine-pyrimethamine reported.
