## RESOLUTIONS AND OTHER ACTIONS OF THE 63nd WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY

- 1. The 63rd World Health Assembly opened on 17 May 2010 in Geneva with officials from 187 member countries in attendance. In her address to the Assembly, the Director-General mentioned the 30 years that had gone by since the World Health Assembly declared that the world and all its people had been freed of smallpox, which was dramatic proof of the power of joint action to make permanent improvements in the human condition. In light of this, she urged the countries to redouble their efforts with respect to the Millennium Development Goals, considering each lesson learned, each approach, and each instrument for advancing toward the achievement of these goals. She noted that the health-related Goals do not refer to national averages but instead, seek to reach the poor, which is the challenge and the measure of success. She also emphasized that the increase in investment for health development is bearing fruit.
- 2. During the first plenary session, the World Health Assembly endorsed the candidacy of. Dr Mondher Zenaidi, Minister of Health of Tunisia, and elected him President of the 63rd World Health Assembly. The Vice Presidents were then elected, with Dr. María Isabel Rodríguez of El Salvador as 1st Vice President. The Assembly then proceeded to the following items:
- a) Appointment of the Committee on Credentials, made up of the delegates of 12 Member States, with the representatives of Nicaragua and Trinidad and Tobago representing the Region of the Americas. In addition, pursuant to Article 24 of the Rules of Procedure, the Committee on Nominations was appointed, which proceeded to choose the President, the Vice Presidents, the Chairmen of the main committees and the officers of the Assembly.
- b) The Agenda of the 63rd World Health Assembly contained 19 items, the majority of them related to health policy and the rest to administrative, budgetary, and institutional matters. As in previous Assemblies, these issues were addressed in the committees and the plenary. The World Health Assembly adopted 10 resolutions. The full versions of these resolutions, as

- c) Most of these resolutions are especially relevant for the Member States of the Region of the Americas and the Regional Office. Of particular interest are those on monitoring of the achievement of the health-related Millennium Development Goals (MDG); the availability, safety, and quality of blood products; advancing food safety initiatives; the global strategy to reduce the harmful use of alcohol, Chagas' disease, and pandemic influenza preparedness.
- 3. The tables in the annexes contain a summary of the respective resolutions.

#### **Other Matters: Executive Board**

- 4. The 127th session of the Executive Board opened on 22 May. The following representatives from the Americas participated in this meeting: Barbados, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Ecuador, and the United States of America.
- 5. The agenda of the 127th session of the Executive Board included items on technical matters such as child injury prevention, cholera, and strategies for the safe management of drinking water for human consumption, in addition to administrative, budgetary, and financial matters; staffing matters, and matters for information. Among other things, the Board took note of the reports submitted and approved the date and location of the 64th the World Health Assembly. It was agreed that the 64th World Health Assembly would be held at the Palais des Nations in Geneva, beginning Monday, 16 May 2011 and ending no later than Tuesday, 24 May 2011. The Executive Board also decided that the 14th meeting of the Program, Budget, and Administration Committee of the Executive Board would be held from Thursday to Friday, 12-13 May 2011 at WHO headquarters.
