The PAHO/WHO Representative Office in Argentina recently published a thematic number titled Mental Health/Human Rights/Justice; the document reflects the experience of the Intersectoral Table that functions in that country for approximately two years. The publication contains articles, interviews, elements of legislation and a great diversity of referential data. The work in the field of mental health is complex and difficult; the publication, precisely addresses aspects of the intersectoral task demonstrating that when there is will and a change of attitude in the involved professionals, there can be generated processes of encounter, shared spaces and promotion of joint initiatives. The studies show that the frequency of persons with mental disabilities increase year after year; and to be able to help these people it is necessary to face the myths and the stigma.

PAHO/WHO has acted as bridge among the parts, facilitating the encounters and collaborating in the permanence and systematization of the exchange opportunities. The results are reflected in this document. The only continuity of work, the permanence of the various actors and the inclusion of new protagonists, is in itself, a significant achievement.

## ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES TECHNICAL SECRETARY FOR DISABILITY

#### Panama

The OAS. has approved the creation in Panama of the technical secretary for people with disabilities. The first lady of the country, Vivian Fernandez de Torrijos, said that "it is necessary to leave the speeches and to start acting". The technical secretariat will serve as support to the program of action for the Decade of the Americas for the rights and the dignity of the people with disabilities 2006-2016.

### UNITED NATIONS GIVE A NEW NAME TO THE INTERNATIONAL DAY OF DISABLED PERSONS

The 18<sup>th</sup> of December the General Assembly of the United Nations gave a new name to the International Day of Disabled Persons, which is celebrated annually on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December, to the International Day of Persons with Disabilities. The 192 States Members of the General Assembly made that decision unanimously when a resolution was adopted on the "Putting into Practice the World-wide Program of Action as far as the Disabled Persons: understanding the Objectives of Development of the Millennium for the persons with disabilities." The Assembly also called the organisms and occupied bodies of the Nations United in the development humanitarian aid and environment protection to assure that the disabilities perspective is incorporated in its work.
