- ELL started shipping specimens for HIV VL to Barbados in 2009.
- Specimens are sent on LIAT from St Lucia to Barbados.
- Samples are collected on a weekly basis, batched and shipped monthly from St Lucia to Barbados.
- Shipment has to be prepared early in the morning to be collected immediately by driver/custom's broker for transport to Barbados.
- This is due to the fact that there is only one LIAT flight per day. The samples are shipped in a box with lots of ice.

Expectations

- Accurate reliable results which are timely.
- Turn around time is good which is approximately 3 weeks.
- Since patients visit the local clinic once every three months then this turn around time fits in well with the clinic schedule.
- The mode of transmission of results is via email which is very convenient and efficient.



- All expenses incurred are currently taken care of by PAHO.
- Prior to PAHO taking care of the expenses it was the World Bank Project that was making the payments.

Challenges

LOCAL LEVEL

- CHALLENGE: There was no -70° C freezer for sample storage, -70° C being the recommended temperature for storing samples. Because of this limitation samples had to be stored in a -20° C freezer.
- **SOLUTION**: However, Ezra Long Laboratory has recently acquired a -70° C freezer which shall be installed soon.

GENERAL

- **CHALLENGE**: In the past the boxes used for shipping samples were not returned to Ezra Long Laboratory.
- The reason is that the responsibility for the payment with regards to returning the boxes were not clearly defined.
- **SOLUTION**: This has now been rectified, and the boxes are being returned.
