Importance of HRH

- O HRH is one of the most critical aspects of the health care system:
 - Generally more than 50% of system expenditures
 - Important impact on health outcomes
 - o right care, delivered in the right place by the right people
 - Difficult to have a well functioning system without a workforce that is:
 - o well trained
 - well treated
 - well motivated
 - o is evolving with system and population needs
 - o is in place
 - At the intersection of the health system and the patient experience



Issues with HRH in the Caribbean

- According to the various reports and analysis of the situation in the Caribbean region (20 goals, CCHIII, HRH Road Map as examples), there is:
 - Lack of reliable information on the workforce
 - Weak governance and planning processes
 - High attrition and out-migration rates and little succession planning
 - Gaps in deployment (rural-urban/types of clinicians/vacancies), capacity and productivity
 - Working conditions that are not optimal to counter pull factors
 - Lack of coordination among education and training organizations

HRH Road Map Milestones (2012-2017)

- 25 Milestones organized in two broad areas:
 - Governance
 - Education and Training



Intent of Governance Milestones

- Better data and information (including on-line observatory and regional data base)
- O Better policy development capacity
- Better HRH planning capacity
- Objective to be a second of the system of the system of the system.



Intent of Governance Milestones (Continued)

- O Better management skills
- O Better hiring guidelines
- More stable, transparent and supportive work environment
- Higher morale
- Improved quality
- Increased productivity
- O Lower cost



Intent of Training and Education Milestones

- Ongoing commitment to staff training & capacity building
- Caribbean Learning Network:
 - courses in planning, evaluation and management
 - online in-service training to work in inter-professional teams
 - course accreditation
- Online management courses for HR managers
- Objective Stills to meet challenges of NCD's and PHC needs
- Upgraded competencies for clinical staff
- Improved working conditions through better staff preparation

Why the Road Map Development Process Matters—Actions

- Stock taking and honest self reflection
- Validation of information
- Expert advice on issues, needs and strategy
- High Level Meeting
- Development of guiding document (Road Map) with milestones and deadlines
- Formation of working groups
- Meetings of working groups



Why the Road Map Development Process Matters—Actors

- High Level meeting grouped representatives from the subregion
- Working groups composed mainly of representatives from the sub-region
- Experts were from the sub-region
- PAHO acted as the facilitator
- Endorsed by Ministers



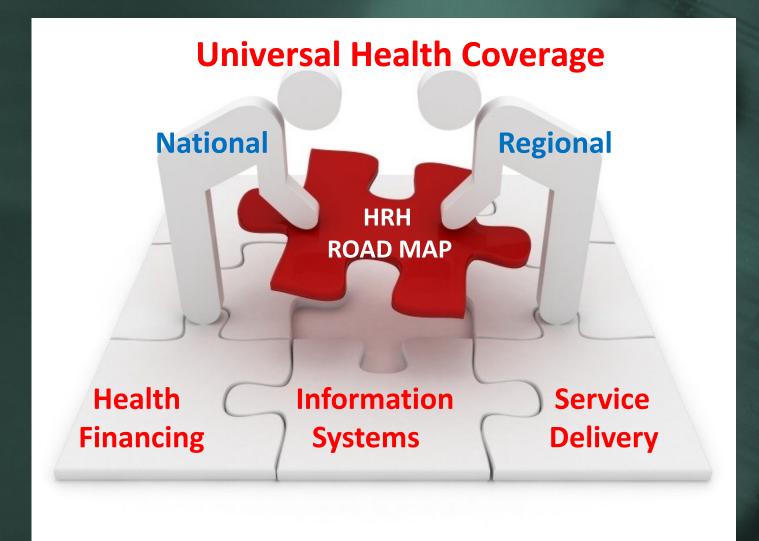
Application to UHC Agenda???

Take Away Points

- No UHC possible without a sustainable workforce
- HRH issues are serious and require concerted action
- A well organized and well functioning HRH:
 - Leads to better health outcomes for the population (which leads to better economic productivity)
 - Results in more financial resources available for technology, pharmaceuticals and services (because of higher productivity, better outcomes, lower demand)
 - Makes Universal Health Care more achievable (more available financial resources and someone is actually there to deliver the services)
- It is possible that the HRH development process is exportable to UHC agenda
