# **Health Care Workers**


- 59.2 million full-time paid health workers worldwide<sup>1</sup>
- 21.7 million healthcare workers in the Americas<sup>1</sup>
- Women represent 70% of the health workforce<sup>2</sup>
- 57 countries have a critical shortage of health human resources<sup>1</sup>






Pan American Health Organization Migration



# Occupational Exposure to Bloodborne Pathogens

- 3 million exposure incidents per year
- In health-care workers:
  40% of Hepatitis B
  40% of Hepatitis C
  4.4% of HIV

# WHO Workers' Health: Global Plan of Action (2007)

1. Devise national policy instruments on workers' health

Specific programs for the occupational health and safety of HCWs

Immunization of HCWs against HBV

- Improve the performance of and access to occupational health services
- 4. Provide and communicate evidence for preventive action
- 5. Incorporate workers' health into other policies

# Occupational Health Hierarchy of Hazards Controls

#### Most effective

- Elimination or substitution (e.g.: eliminate unnecessary injections)
  - Engineering Controls (e.g.: safer needle devices, sharps containers, mechanical lift)
  - Administrative (policies and training programmes)
  - Work Practices (Universal Precautions, no recapping)

Least effective Personal Protective Equipment (gloves, masks, gowns, etc)
