WHO Reform Overview

- Since its introduction in 2011, WHO has reported significant progress towards becoming more effective, efficient, transparent, and accountable.
- Overall, 84% of reform outputs are now at implementation phase and the rate of completion is 60%.
- Implementation uneven across the 3 streams: programmatic reforms progressed the furthest, governance reforms the least.
- The Ebola outbreak highlighted the need to reform WHO response to outbreaks and health emergencies.





Key Reforms Implemented

- Bottom up planning & priority setting initiated in PAHO in 2014-2015 replicated at WHO in the 2016-2017
- Financing WHO's base budget at the start of the budgetary period increased over the last three biennia (from 62% to 80%)
- WHO's web portal, with detailed information on financial flows by source down to the country office level
- Revised HR strategies
- Risk registers and mitigation plans





Open Reform Items

- Second Open-ended Intergovernmental Meeting on governance reform April 24-25 in Geneva
- Meeting of Member States working group on Framework for Engagement with Non-State Actors (FENSA) after governance meeting last week of April 2016
- PAHO will convene virtual meeting on implications of governance reform and FENSA mid-April
- Emergencies and Outbreaks
 - o Platform scaling-up and rapid response, including workforce
 - Uniform emergency business rules and processes across all three levels
 - Secure source of financing
 - Country capacity-building
