

## COURSE TRAINING AID IN ORAL HEALTH FOR INDIGENOUS

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The course was conducted from August 2013 to October 2014 through a partnership between the Special Indigenous Sanitary District (DSEI) Cuiabá and the School of Public Health of the State of Mato Grosso (ESPMT) in order to qualify the indigenous workers as auxiliary in oral health - ASB, with skills and abilities to carry out actions to promote health and prevention in oral health, contributing to improving the quality of oral health of the indigenous community.

We selected 20 students of Basic Health Units that have dental office. The requirements for the selection were age 18, completion of primary education and indication by the community. Most students had already been performing volunteer activities in oral health in their villages.

The course with 600 hours was organized in three periods of concentration (theoretical and practical) carried out in Chapada dos Guimarães, Poconé and Cuiabá and three periods of Dispersion (Supervised Internship), with reference to the problematical pedagogy and cultural context and epidemiological of indigenous communities involved.



All stages of dispersion were performed in the dental office located in the Basic Health Units of the villages where students reside. The evaluation of the teaching-learning process had training and procedural character, in order to verify the development of skills and abilities, allowing for the re-planning and the adoption of alternative teaching and learning strategies.

The course was extremely important, since 18 students were trained in accordance with the Guidelines for the Attention to Oral Health in the Special Indigenous Health Districts, Dentistry Code of Ethics and the Law 11,889 of December 24, 2008 which regulates the exercise professions Technician in Oral Health (TSB) and Assistant Oral Health (ASB), enabling an improvement in clinical care and preventive actions to reduce the rates of caries and periodontal disease in indigenous communities DSEI Cuiabá.
