Saint Kitts and Nevis (Ages 13-15) Global Youth Tobacco Survey (GYTS)



FACT SHEET

The Saint Kitts and Nevis GYTS includes data on prevalence of cigarette and other tobacco use as well as information on five determinants of tobacco use: access/availability and price, exposure to secondhand smoke (SHS), cessation, media and advertising, and school curriculum. These determinants are components Saint Kitts and Nevis could include in a comprehensive tobacco control program.

The Saint Kitts and Nevis GYTS was a school-based survey of students in grades 9, 10 and 11 conducted in 2002.

A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce representative data for Saint Kitts and Nevis. At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 100.0%, the class response rate was 100.0%, the student response rate was 57.0%, and the overall response rate was 57.0%. A total of 843 students aged 13-15 participated in the Saint Kitts and Nevis GYTS.

Prevalence

17.3% of students had ever smoked cigarettes (Boy = 24.7%, Girl = 11.5%)

16.6% currently use any tobacco product (Boy = 18.2%, Girl = 13.6%)

4.6% currently smoke cigarettes (Boy = 7.0%, Girl = 1.9%)

13.7% currently use other tobacco products (Boy = 14.6%, Girl = 12.1%)

15.6% of never smokers are likely to initiate smoking next year

Knowledge and Attitudes

36.5% think boys and 17.9% think girls who smoke have more friends 7.0% think boys and 4.7% think girls who smoke look more attractive

Access and Availability - Current Smokers

16.0% buy cigarettes in a store

Exposure to Secondhand Smoke (SHS)

16.5% live in homes where others smoke in their presence

48.8% are around others who smoke in places outside their home

77.1% think smoking should be banned from public places

65.1% think smoke from others is harmful to them

16.3% have one or more parents who smoke

5.7% have most or all friends who smoke

Cessation - Current Smokers

55.1% have ever received help to stop smoking

Media and Advertising

77.0% saw anti-smoking media messages, in the past 30 days

67.1% saw pro-cigarette ads in newspapers or magazines, in the past 30 days

17.6% have an object with a cigarette brand logo

7.7% were offered free cigarettes by a tobacco company representative

School

41.3% had been taught in class, during the past year, about the dangers of smoking

32.3% had discussed in class, during the past year, reasons why people their age smoke

47.0% had been taught in class, during the past year, the effects of tobacco use

Highlights

- 16.6% of students currently use any form of tobacco; 4.6% currently smoke cigarettes; 13.7% currently use some other form of tobacco.
- SHS exposure is high 16.5% of students live in homes where others smoke, and half of the students are exposed to smoke around others outside of the home; 16.3% of students have at least one parent who smokes.
- Almost two-thirds of the students think smoke from others is harmful to them.
- Over three-quarters of the students think smoking in public places should be banned.
- One in 6 students has an object with a cigarette brand logo on it.
- More than three-quarters of the students saw anti-smoking media messages in the past 30 days; two-thirds of the students saw pro-tobacco ads in newspapers or magazines in the past 30 days.
