Terms and Conditions

Awards

In addition of national recognitions, an international jury will select one winners under each of the following award categories:

1. Interventions on lifestyles (diet, alcohol, physical activity, injury prevention, tobacco use, sexual health, addictions, etc.)
2. Healthy environments at the university campus
3. Promoting health through community outreach
4. National Health Promoting Universities Network

Both national and international winners will received an official diploma. In addition, all winning experiences will be documented and disseminated through PAHO's website and social media channels. Also, the four international winners will be acknowledge with a commemorative plate signed by the Director of the Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization.
