Indicator 1. Policies, Plans and Networks

By the end of 2007, all four countries will have incorporated a youth component in their National HIV/AIDS Plan and will have operational plans for implementation of the health related recommendations in the reporting process of the 'Convention on the Rights of the Child' (CRC), with an emphasis on adolescents and Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH), in collaboration with national, subregional and regional networks of health professionals that work with young people and SRH.
