


What is Zika?

Zika is a virus transmitted by the Aedes mosquito, which also transmits dengue and chikungunya.





Onset is usually 2-7 days after the mosquito bite



1 in 4 people with Zika infection develops symptoms



A very small number of people can develop complications after becoming ill with the virus

How is Zika infection prevented?

To prevent mosquito bites that transmit Zika:



long-sleeve clothing, trousers and hats



health authorities



by mosquito nets




hold water, such as tires, buckets and flower pots, both inside and outside of dwellings to eliminate mosquito breeding sites

Use screens or mosquito nets in windows

There is no vaccine or specific drug against this virus. Only pain and fever can be treated.

Get plenty of bed rest










Wear clothing that covers arms and legs
