This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.



Early serological studies show that most of the population is still susceptible to COVID-19. Until there is a vaccine, the comprehensive package of measures is our most effective set of tools to tackle the virus.

WHO issued a document on school-related public health measures as an annex to the considerations in adjusting public health and social measures in the context of COVID-19 (from 16 April 2020).

Deciding to close, partially close or reopen schools should be guided by a risk-based approach to maximize the educational and health benefit for students, teachers, staff, and the wider community, and help prevent a new outbreak of COVID-19 in the community. Hygiene and daily practices should be in place and include hand hygiene, respiratory hygiene, mask use if mandated by local authorities, symptom screening and physical distancing.


Five criteria should be considered:

- 1) Current understanding about virus transmission in children
- 2) Local epidemiological situation
- 3) School setting and IPC measures in place
- 4) Harm as a result of school closure
- 5) Partial school opening for children of "key workers"



PAHO's Response



PAHO Director asks countries to address health, social and economic emergencies together, as COVID-19 expands in the Americas

Washington D.C., May 12, 2020 (PAHO)—The Director of the Pan American Health Organization, Carissa F. Etienne, called on countries to address health, social and economic emergencies, saying she is "deeply concerned" by the rapid expansion of the novel coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic in the Americas.

"The pandemic has forced us to address three emergencies at the same time: health, social and economic emergencies. To be successful, we need a joint approach," said Dr. Etienne.

PAHO's Director highlighted the rapid expansion of COVID-19. "It took our region three months to reach 1 million cases, but less than three weeks to nearly double that number," she said. More than 1.74 million cases of COVID-19 have been reported in the Americas, with more than 104,000 deaths. Read more...
