

Resuming International Travel in the Caribbean

This webinar is for the health, tourism, immigration, and other relevant sectors for sharing experiences and providing technical guidance.

The expected outcome - Build common understanding on decision-making process for resuming non-essential travel during COVID-19.

SAVE THE DATE: 17 July 2020, 11:00am

Resuming incoming non-essential international travel is not exempt from the risk of importation of SARS-CoV-2 virus, and the decision to do so should be gradual and will be dynamic in terms of adjusting restrictions.

The key factors that should inform the reiterative risk assessment process, underpinning the dynamic decision-making process related to the resuming or restricting non-essential international travel are the:

- i. public health and health services capacity in destination countries and territories;
- ii. analysis of the probability of importation of SARS-CoV-2 virus based on the COVID-19 epidemiological situation at the origin of the voyage of the conveyance and/or traveler (e.g., countries ore territories experiencing community transmission are associated with a greater risk of importation of SARS-COV-2 virus);
- iii. communication capacity in countries and territories.

On Tuesday, 7 July 2020, the PAHO/WHO Office for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean hosted a webinar on NCDs and COVID-19: Building Back Better Services.

The webinar was developed to explore the relation with NCDs and COVID-19 latest data and operational guidance, with key insights from experts and country perspectives on how to balance the demands of the health system during the pandemic, and how to execute an adaptive, forward-looking strategy inclusive of Non-Communicable Diseases to build back better.

More than 180 professionals attended the webinar. Among them were representatives from Ministries of Health, Agriculture, Education, Commerce, Transport; Planning Units; Non- Governmental Organizations; Regional and International Organizations; Academia; Trade Unions; Private Sector; Media; Youth Representatives and Persons Living with Noncommunicable Diseases.
