This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories, and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.

# ECLAC and PAHO: Controlling the pandemic requires convergence and coordination between health, economic, social and productive policies

A new joint report by the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) and the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) reveals that economies of the Region will only be reactivated if the curve of contagion of the COVID-19 pandemic is flattened. The report proposes a three-phase approach that includes the adoption of health, economic, social and productive policies that aim to control and mitigate the effects of the pandemic, reactivation with protection, and rebuilding in a sustainable and inclusive way.

Some countries have led the Region to become the current epicenter of the pandemic, topping global case numbers. As of 29 July, there have been more than 4.5 million cases of COVID-19 and almost 190,000 deaths in Latin America and the Caribbean. A significant number of countries remain far from achieving a sustained and significant flattening of the curve of contagion. The pandemic has also unleashed an unprecedented economic and social crisis which, if urgent measures are not taken, could transform into a hunger and humanitarian crisis.





#### **PAHO's Response**

#### **Reopening Grenada's Borders**

On July 15<sup>th</sup> 2020, Grenada reopened its borders to commercial flights from countries across the Caribbean viewed as low risk. On detecting the first case of COVID-19 on March 22<sup>nd</sup> 2020, the Government of Grenada announced the same day closure of the Maurice Bishop International Airport (MBIA), to all commercial passenger traffic until further notice.

In preparation for reopening of borders, Grenada has increased its capacity to test, trace and isolate cases of COVID-19. During a press conference on Tuesday July 14<sup>th</sup> 2020, the Honourable Nickolas Steele, Minister of Health, Social Security and International Business, announced that an additional 70-75 contact tracers had been trained and that Grenada now has the capacity to conduct 300 PCR tests daily. Once commissioned the PCR Machine at the General Hospital will run alongside the testing facility that is currently operational at St. George's University.

PAHO continues to provide support to Grenada during the pandemic, particularly in the areas of laboratory and testing. PAHO has provided training in the protocols and procedures for testing for COVID-19, ongoing support for laboratory testing, and laboratory supplies including test kits and reagents. PAHO has also donated a PCR Machine to increase the capacity for testing in country, for which PAHO has provided support with the installation process and will provide ongoing training as the needs are identified.
