

This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories, and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.

Latest update on Covid-19 vaccine development



- Currently, over <u>165 candidate vaccines</u> are at some stage of development. Of these, about 26 vaccine candidates are in human trial. At least 3-4 going into phase III. AstraZeneca, Moderna and CanSino are in or starting Phase III
- <u>COVAX Facility</u>, the vaccines pillar of the <u>ACT-Accelerator</u>, convened by CEPI, Gavi and WHO, is speeding up the search for an effective vaccine for all countries. At the same time, it is supporting the building of manufacturing capabilities, and buying supply ahead of time so that 2 billion doses can be equitably distributed by the end of 2021.
- Seventy-five countries submitted expressions of interest in the COVAX Facility, joining another 90 countries that could be supported by the COVAX Advance Market Commitment (AMC). The COVAX Facility is a mechanism designed to guarantee rapid, fair and equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines worldwide. <u>Read more</u>.
- Along with accelerating research and ensuring manufacturing capacity, WHO is also working with countries to develop **regulatory capacity**, as well as supportive **policies and delivery channels**. These will be essential to get a successful vaccine out to people.
- The speed of vaccine development has been extraordinary. Work on developing vaccines began as soon as Chinese scientists publishing the sequence on 11 January. First phase 1 trial started 8-10 weeks after that. WHO has been involved in R&D efforts since January
- WHO maintains a <u>draft landscape of candidate vaccines</u>. There are also <u>target product profiles</u> for COVID-19 vaccines, developed through a consultation with global experts.
- WHO is setting up Solidarity vaccine trials to test candidate vaccines across the globe.

PAHO's Response

BVI and PAHO Launch project to equip citizens



Citizens of the British Virgin Islands (BVI) are better equipped to manage the challenges presented by COVID-19 and the hurricane season.

On August 20th, the BVI/PAHO Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) Project was officially launched, as well as the COVID-19 and Disaster Mental Health and Psychosocial Plan.

The initiatives form part of the ongoing *"Bounce Back Stronger" Resilience Campaign,* developed by PAHO/WHO and the Ministry of Health of the BVI, to help health care professionals respond to disasters.

To date, two hundred persons have been trained in such disciplines as Psychological First Aid and stress management, in other projects which form the *"Bounce Back Stronger"* Resilience Campaign.

In his opening remarks, Representative of the PAHO/WHO for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean, Dr. Yitades Gebre, commended the BVI people for their resilience. "On March 25, the Virgin Islands confirmed its first two cases of COVID-19. Six months later, the BVI can express pride at the achievements made in containing the pandemic".
