### **Situation Overview**

- Volcano continues to erupt. Another explosive eruption was reported around 11:08am on April 22, 2021
- Argyle International Airport to reopen on Saturday April 24, 2021 with Cargo Terminal returning to normal operations from Friday April 23, 2021
- The volcano alert level remains RED



### **Health Situation**



- PAHO continues to discuss short, medium and long term needs with MoH.
- PAHO prepares additional shipment of masks, N95, face shields, water bladders, PCR test kits, buckets, collapsible jerrycans, urinals, working gloves, reflective vests, caution tape, aqua tabs and laboratory supplies. Shipment is facilitated by WFP and arrives in VCT Saturday 24 April, 2021 at 8:00am.

### Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

- Central Water and Sewerage Authority (CWSA) announced that beginning today (April 22), a nightly reduction of water supply to 12 villages, including Kingstown, due to reduction in river flows and increased demand.
- Meeting with CWSA on 22 April 2021
- The team discussed possible collaboration between PAHO/UNICEF/Water Mission on strengthening resilience and operation efficiency of CWSA, specifically:
  - 1. Purchase of new WaterTruck (UNICEF/Water Mission)
  - 2. Laboratory Capacity in collaboration with HACH (UNICEF/PAHO)
  - 3. Reduction in unaccounted for water (Water Mission)
  - 4. Groundwater exploration (Water Mission)
  - 5. Turbidity actuator (automatically closing intake when turbidity is in access of threshold level.) Water Mission)
  - 6. Sludge management from sedimentation chamber at water treatment plant (Water Mission)
- With UNICEF, 3 shelters were visited on 21 April 2021 and the following were noted:
  - At Barrouallie Leeward Central Secondary School, water meter was not working and

### Health Needs

#### Evaluation of Air quality

Meeting held today (April 22) with CMO and PAHO response team and the following needs were determined:

- The strengthening of the public health laboratory facilities is of specific interest to the ministry because of a WB-OECS project proposal.
- Short term support requested from MoH to PAHO includes:

the main water line was bypassed by new line to high level tanks on the roof. It is suspected that water meter is clogged with volcanic ash. Two high level tanks were also found to be leaking onto the volcanic ash laden flat roof and draining into a nearby overflow. There is a risk of clogging of these many overflows as ash will wash down and clog the drain pipes. The residual chlorine was 0.0

- At Barrouallie Government school, BRAGSA was completing repairs to the water supply system to the school (April 21). The pressure was increased but the residual chlorine was 0.0. The shelter has intermittent running water of 0.5 ppm residual chlorine. There are 13 toilets and urinals - 6 female; 4 male and 3 staff toilets (not gender assigned) now used by the evacuees.
- At Brethren Grace and Truth Bible Camp, two 1000 gals tank store water on elevated structure and were refilled by tanker truck this afternoon (April 21) as the supply was intermittent. The residual chlorine was 0.3, but considering that the tank was 1/3 filled before new water was added, it can be calculated that the residual chloring in the tanker truck was about 0.5.
- Support in coordinating the health emergency operations between the MoH and its departments with NEMO and the external organization.
- Identification and rental of temporary space for H-EOC

 Hiring of data entry persons to collected surveillance data on COVID-19 testing, vaccination, shelter health date, HCF information, disease surveillance, vector control and dengue.

### PAHO Response Actions

- Continued coordination with Ministry of Health on health emergency actions
- Continued monitoring of water quality in health care facilities and shelters
- Provided regular health update at the Caribbean Development Partnership Group (CDPG)
- Participated in the inter-agency shelter meeting which discussed immediate and long-term hous-

ing requirements. PAHO Wash advisor provided further input on assessments and medium-term interventions to improve functionality of shelters

- Participated/Facilitated the meeting on air quality, including participation from MoH, CARPHA and IVHHN.
- Preparation of supplies and materials to be send to St Vincent. ETA 24 April 2021 at 8:00am




Figure 1. Map showing location of Health Care Facilities
