#### **Situation Overview**

- Seismic activity at La Soufrière, St Vincent has remained low since the tremor associated with the explosion and ash venting on 22 April.
- The Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines has lowered the volcanic alert level at La Soufrière to ORANGE on 6th May 2021, based on recommendation from The University of the West Indies Seismic Research Centre (UWI-SRC).

## **Health Situation**

- Teams of health personnel visit the shelters daily to administer COVID-19 vaccinations and tests; as well as carry out syndromic surveillance (Coughs, Fevers and Diarrhoea); none of these three symptoms were reported.
- The Ministry of Health (MoH) continues its campaign to urge the public to exercise public health and social measures; to wear masks, practice hand hygiene, keep physical distance, and people with high-risk conditions and vulnerable for severe illness to receive vaccines to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

# **PAHO Response Actions**

## Health Coordination/Logistics/General Assistance

 Dr. Yitades Gebre, PAHO/WHO Representative for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean Countries (PWR) made a site visit to SVG. During that visit the PWR met with the Minister of Health, Wellnes and the Environment, Permanent Secretary, and the Chief Medical Officer on July 15th, 2021 to discuss the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), European Commission Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection Department (ECHO), and Malta (Republic of) donor grants and the challenges encountered in in implementing the grants thus far. Discussions also centred around the logistics challenges related to storage of supplies, the upcoming air quality project, the implementation of Early Warning Alert and Response System (EWARS), and the purchase of a 4-wheel drive vehicle to facilitate the implementation of the programmes.

- The Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization (PAHO/WHO) has facilitated the shipment of one hundred thousand (100,000) face masks to arrive in SVG. The face masks are a humanitarian donation from the German Government via the PAHO/WHO Office for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean Countries to MOH and is intended to support SVG in the response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- PAHO is supporting the MOH through a collaborative effort with CARPHA to establish an Early Warning Alert and Response System (EWARS-ina-box) to aide in rapidly detecting and responding to outbreaks and other public health events in the shelters and other areas affected by the volcanic eruption or future disasters. The collection of essential, minimal data on selected diseases and the timely, rapid analysis of trends is key to this activity. PAHO will provide the equipment and a technical expert arrived in SVG on July 17th, 2021 to conduct training in a joint PAHO/MOH/CARPHA programme. PAHO and CARPHA will be meeting with the Ministry of Health colleagues on 20-21 July for a preliminary coordination meeting to discuss the strategy and other details of the training which will begin at the end of this week and last through the end of next week.
  - A total of 38 participants 21 from the 9 health districts, 5 from selected shelters, and 12 from various Units at the Ministry of Health – have been selected to participate in the EWARS

- training in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines. The participants will be composed of District Medical Officers, Nurses, Epidemiologists, Surveillance Officers, Laboratory Technicians, Environmental Health Officers, Disaster coordinators, and officers from the Health Security Unit.
- The deployment of EWARS-in-a-box field-based system will benefit MOH with real-time reporting and analysis of early warning data related to the emergency. It will also support the more systematic registering of alerts and strengthen the role of rapid response teams in the verification, risk assessment and response.
- Air Quality monitoring project has received MOH approval. The company will send a representative to SVG in August with the equipment conduct the installation and provide support to the local team. PAHO will provide on-the-ground support to this project as necessary. This project will also be duplicated in Barbados to monitor air quality in that location.
- MHPSS work is ongoing. PAHO is supporting two interventions and working with MOH Focal Point:
  - Support mechanism for health care workers (HCW)
  - Identification of referral pathways
- PAHO has budgeted US\$178,000 to support the procurement of equipment to re-establish hemodialysis at the Georgetown Modern Medical Clinic.
  - PAHO to procure 4 dialysis machines, 8 dialysis chairs, and pre-dialysis equipment to operationalize the unit
- PAHO continues to support the MOH is researching solutions for medical/surgical supply management. PAHO is assisting to identify additional temporary and, for the longer term, permanent storage solutions.

 PAHO is providing support, along with UNICEF, through a social media campaign to decrease vaccine hesitancy as part of the MoH Communication Plan to decrease vaccine hesitancy.



These communication materials include videos, social media cards, and radio public service announcements. The main topics covered are:

- How vaccines are developed
- How vaccines work
- Vaccine safety
- Side effects of vaccines
- The benefits of vaccines
- PAHO facilitates the use of the Annex to the Health Emergency Operations Center (H-EOC) for coordination of the health response and has supplied the furniture and several appliances.

 PAHO has commissioned a videographer who produced three (3) Public Service Announcements (PSA's) to support MOH Risk Communication on hygiene and sanitation, mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) and healthy eating for diabetics and hypertensives during disasters. PAHO facilitated the production and airing of these PSAs. All videos are airing on the Ministry of Health Facebook page and as of July 19th, 2021 the hygiene and sanitation video has been viewed 1.7K times, the MPHSS viewed 5.3K times, and healthy eating 1.9K times.

- PAHO has facilitated the printing of posters for health care facilities and shelters:
  - 3 vehicle wraps for MHPSS
  - 13 COVID-19 posters
  - 23 volcanic ash posters
  - 80 mental health wellness cards
- PAHO supports MoH with Post Disaster Needs Assessment (Health), conducted by UNDP as requested by the Government of SVG. Representative UNDP arrived in SVG on 6th July, 2021 and will met with the appropriate MOH and PAHO staff to collect the necessary information and data. The assessment process and report writing is anticipated to last till mid-August 2021.

## Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MPHSS)

- PAHO is working with Ministry of Health on the implementation of the proposed MHPSS strategy.
- A mapping exercise to identify MHPSS support provided by supporting organizations was finalized to improve coordination. Report will be shared with MoH and health partners when finalized.
- MHPSS and Psychological First Aid (PFA): PFA is fundamentally about providing humane and compassionate care. It is a primary tool for supporting people after an emergency and is delivered as a community-based strategy.
  - 35 persons participated in the seminars overall. Some persons attended two out of the three sessions. The majority of attendees were from the Mental Health Rehabilitation Centre, the Red Cross and Liberty Lodge
  - The series of webinars is expected to equip community leaders and front line workers who interact with the public during an emergency with the knowledge of PFA; establish a database of persons trained in PFA which will be useful during a major disaster where a coordinated approach to MHPSS is required; and Form part of the preparedness response for the Hurricane Season.

## Non-communicable Diseases (NCD)

PAHO purchased 3 Non-Communicable Disease (NCD) kits. Each kit is estimated to provide medicines and medical supplies for a population of 10,000 persons for 3 months for the management of diseases such as diabetes, hypertension and cardiovascular disease. The estimated date of delivery is 16th August, 2021 for the first component and PAHO will provide necessary training for MOH.

# Water, Sanitation and Health (WASH)

PAHO team has completed the update to the health care facilities database for WASH. MOH Team identification of priorities for WASH (and backup power) interventions remains outstanding.

# **Health Partner Activities**

- UNFPA has provided guidance tools for distribution of Dignity Kits and strongly advises all partners who
  are planning on distributing the kits to follow this guidance, as well as global guidelines and minimum standards.
- UNFPA has been providing ongoing technical guidance to the Ministry of Health and the Family Planning Association on provision and access to SRH services and information for the affected populations
- UNFPA supported the Ministry of Health to map the health facilities to emergency shelters. An assessment report was prepared with key recommendations for further action
- UNFPA partnered with the OECS Commission to train 11 key personnel from health, gender, emergency and civil society on the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) for Reproductive Health in emergencies. An Action Plan was developed with key interventions to inform both response and recovery phases.
- UNFPA is supporting strengthening of the health system to provide comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services as part of the recovery phase

- WFP is supporting PAHO logistics and providing food vouchers, cash transfers to displaced health care workers and vulnerable groups.
- UNWOMAN, UNICEF, IOM and IFRC are also helping in MHPSS
- USAID Representative Doug Mercado made a site visit to SVG, met with health officials and PAHO staff, and visited Evesham Health Facility on 9th July 2021.
