# PAHO Director urges countries to prioritize hard-hit indigenous communities in COVID-19 pandemic responses

Washington, D.C., Aug. 4, 2021 (PAHO)— Pan American Health Organization Director Carissa F. Etienne reported that 617,000 indigenous people have been infected with COVID-19 in the Americas and urged countries to prioritize the hard-hit communities.

"It's likely that many more have been infected, but we may not know it because they have struggled to get the COVID care they deserve," she said during her weekly media briefing. She added that "nearly 15,000 (indigenous people) have died from COVID complications since the start of the pandemic." The statistics are based on data from several countries.

In advance of International Day of

the World's Indigenous Peoples, observed August 9, Dr. Etienne noted that the pandemic has exacerbated inequalities in the Americas, adding that most indigenous peoples lack the financial and social safety nets to ensure they can continue to provide for their families and communities, even when they're sick.

Many of our indigenous peoples live in remote and isolated areas where a clinic or a doctor may be many kilometers or days away. Even those who live in urban centers still face invisible barriers – like language, stigma, and poverty – that can keep health care out of reach," she said.

response and ensure that health workers are sensitive to the needs and languages of indigenous communities, and "respect the tradition of ancestral medicine still practiced by many of our indigenous peoples," Dr. Etienne urged.

She noted that 17 countries in the Americas have listed indigenous peoples as a priority group for COVID vaccinations and vaccination campaigns are underway in those and other countries.

| BARBADOS                               | 12 new COVID-19 cases were reported on August 6, 2021. 77,922 persons are now fully vaccinated, which is 28.8% of the population.   |
| BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS                 | 12,187 persons are now fully vaccinated. On Tuesday, August 3, thirty-five (35) BVI residents were transported to the US Virgin Islands (USVI) to an alternative COVID-19 vaccine. Only the AstraZeneca brand of the vaccine is available in the BVI. But through a BVI-USVI Vaccination Bubble Initiative, residents are able to travel to the USVI and get either the Pfizer or the Johnson & Johnson vaccines.   |
| DOMINICA                               | 19,661 persons are now fully vaccinated. There is a growing cluster of cases presently occurring in Dominica, as a result new COVID-19 measures including a curfew order was implemented effective August 03, 2021 for 7 days. | ST. KITTS AND<br>NEVIS                 | 19,948 persons are now fully vaccinated. The Ministry of Health and Wellnes received a donation of 20 oxygen concentrators from The Republic of China (Taiwan) for the treatment of patients with COVID-19.   |
| SAINT LUCIA                            | During the period 3-5 August 2021, 25 new COVID-19 cases were confirmed. In an August 5 report the Ministry of Health reported one death, bringing the total deaths in country to 90. 25,275 persons are now fully vaccinated.  |
| SAINT VINCENT<br>AND THE<br>GRENADINES | 10,008 persons are now fully vaccinated. On August 6, 2021, the Ministry of Health and Wellness was informed by CARPHA of one sample detected with the Delta variant.   |



#### Vaccines Campaign

In most countries, vaccinations are not mandatory and thus public willingness to be vaccinated against COVID-19 is of high priority to achieve the goal of reaching herd immunity. As we seek to tackle vaccine hesitancy related to COVID-19 vaccines in the Caribbean and in keeping with the request made by some member states, the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) in collaboration with the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) have developed communication materials to address some of the gaps in knowledge and concerns on the COVID-19 vaccines. Launched 21 May 2021, these communication materials include videos, social media cards, and radio public service announcements. The main topics covered are:

- How vaccines are developed
- How vaccines work
- Vaccine safety
- Side effects of vaccines
- The benefits of vaccines

#### Tracking SARS-CoV-2 Variant in the Americas



Coordinated by PAHO and comprised of laboratories from 24 countries in the Region, the COVID-19 Genomic Surveillance Regional Network (COVIGEN) monitors the virus that causes COVID-19 to detect any change in its sequence that may influence its ability to spread, disease severity, vaccine effectiveness, treatments, diagnostics, or other public health and social measures. How does the network work? What is the current distribution of the variants of concern? And why is this network important to help end the pandemic and prepare for the future?

Washington, DC, July 2021 (PAHO) - Fifty samples from people who tested positive for COVID-19 depart from Santo Domingo airport in the Dominican Republic for Rio de Janeiro. Their destination is the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (FIOCRUZ) laboratory for genomic sequencing of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. The results of these strategically selected samples representing different regions of the country will produce an overview of circulating variants and provide guidance for public health measures to fight the pandemic. Lack of established capacity for genomic sequencing and monitoring of the virus that causes COVID-19 has not a been an issue for the countries of the Americas since the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) created the COVID-19 Genomic Surveillance Regional Network (COVIGEN) in March 2020, comprised of public health laboratories from 24 countries in the Region.
