The HEU, Centre for Health Economics (HEU) provides research and technical support to national and regional institutions engaged in the delivery of health and social services at the individual, community and national levels, with the overall objective of providing evidence for the development of policies and legislation that improves the conditions under which people live.


- Specifically, the HEU is collaborating the Ministries of Health in selected OECS countries to provide **training to key personnel in the use of SHA2011**. This will be done through two capacity building workshops for each country. A 10-week online course is also being developed to supplement these workshops and to provide capacity building for the wider region.
- The HEU is also undertaking **research on the Burden of Disease, Health System Capacity and Macroeconomic profile** for selected countries with the aim of supporting health financing system reform.
- We are also engaged in the **development and tailoring of Health Financing Matrices and Financial Protection Indicators** for selected countries. The HEU will provide training to key stakeholders in these areas through two virtual workshops.

Deliverables

- A 10-week virtual course in SHA2011
- Two virtual capacity building workshops in selected countries in the use of SHA2011
- Populated Health Financing Matrices and Health Protection Indicators for selected countries
- Two virtual capacity building workshops in the use of the Health Financing Matrix and Health Protection Indicators



Recommendations

- Build capacity in the use of SHA2011 in the region to enable sustainable use of the tool to track the flow of expenditure throughout the health sector.
- Enable the use of the Health Financing Matrix and the Health Protection Indicators to facilitate effective monitoring and evaluation.
- Assess health financing arrangements in regional countries to determine the need for reform.
