COVID-19 - Highlights

- Peru: A medicinal oxygen generating plant was opened at the Ate Vitarte Emergency Hospital of the Ministry of Health. The plant will supply more than 30 patients simultaneously, 24 hours a day. Also put in place was 15 fully equipped isolation cubicles, which will strengthen care of COVID-19 patients in critical condition. Additional details are found here: https://bit.ly/3eqYVP6
- Brazil: Until May 21, the Ministry of Health, through the Special Secretariat for Indigenous Health (SESAI), will bring vaccines to the 34 Special Indigenous Health Districts. The expansion of immunization of the indigenous population is part of the World Vaccination Week coordinated by PAHO and carefully planned so that the regions that need it most are prioritized. Based on viral genomic sequencing, on 14 December 2020, the authorities of the United Kingdom reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as B.1.1.7; on 18 December 2020, the authorities of the Republic of South Africa reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as B.1.351; and, on 13 January 2021, the authorities of Brazil reported to WHO a SARS-CoV-2 variant known as P.1. SARS-CoV-2 variants B.1.1.7, B.1.351, and P.1 are defined as Variants of Concern (VOC). In October 2020, SARS-CoV-2 variant B.1.617 was identified in India and it is defined as a SARS-CoV-2 Variant of Interest (VOI).

Starting on 18 December 2020, WHO shared that information with authorities across the globe about SARS-CoV-2 VOCs and VOI, through dedicated channels established under the International Health Regulations (IHR), as well with the public through the WHO web site. 1,2,3

International traffic-related measures adopted by States Parties in the Americas in response to the detection of SARS-CoV-2 variants

The table below summarizes international traffic-related measures adopted by States Parties to the IHR in the Region of the Americas in response to the detection of SARS-CoV-2 variants. Measures adopted are consistent with current Temporary Recommendations, ^{4,5} issued by the Director-General of WHO in the context of the Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC), determined on 30 January 2020 according to IHR provisions.










Argentina: On 14 March 2021, due to daylight savings time observed in Eastern Standard Time zone, the Argentina data is no longer published by 3:00PM EST same day and is henceforth included in the following day table. Between 22 February and 14 March 2021, the data had corresponded to the same date.

Ecuador: According to a 6 September Ecuador Ministry of Public Health press release, only cases confirmed by RT-PCR will be reported; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 8,956 cases. Available at: https://bit.ly/3h2EWEA

Guadeloupe: Deaths are aggregated for Guadeloupe, Saint Martin and Saint Barthelemy in Santé Publique France weekly publications; death counts for Guadeloupe are calculated subtracting deaths in Saint Martin and Saint Barthelemy. Available at: https://bit.ly/39UMysd

Puerto Rico: Aggregated case total as reported by the Puerto Rico Department of Health (DoH); 118,455 were positive by RT-PCR and 15,913 were positive by antigen tests; previously, cases who tested positive by either RT-PCR or serological RDTs were reported, resulting in the exclusion of 33,965 cases.
