General Objective

To contribute, with the countries of Latin America and the Caribbean, to the expansion and sustainability of the HIV response and in particular the comprehensive care through a partnership between national programs, health services, expert clinicians in the field and representatives of civil society, based on an agreed platform of strategies and measures with the finality to reduce the number of new infections and achieve the greatest possible number of people with effective and sustained viral suppression.

Specific Objectives

- Share scientific data to support the provision of services, reduce gaps in the steps of the HIV continuum of care cascade, identify policies, regulations and other actions necessary to achieve the goals of universal access by the end of 2015.

- Share experiences in implementing an accelerated response in the continuum of care, especially in the timely diagnosis and the earlier initiation of treatment.
- Exchange ideas with representatives of civil society to strengthen the sustained participation of civil society in the care and treatment across the HIV care cascade.
- Develop and validate new targets to 2020 (regional and national) along with progress in the response to HIV treatment of the 2015 Initiative, based on the regional monitoring framework and agreed indicators for monitoring progress related to expansion and strengthening of HIV treatment programs.
- Promote dialogue between national health and finance sectors based on data and program experience, to improve the sustainability and the strategic use of available resources in the care and treatment of HIV, identifying financial issues to be addressed in the implementation of framework investment.
