- Multifactorial determinants
- Affecting health, illness, disability
- Consequences for individuals' & populations' health
- Significant economic & development consequences

Multifactorial Determinants

- Biological, genetic, psychological
- Nutrition, fitness
- Economic, cultural, environmental
- Primary, secondary, & tertiary prevention
- · Co-morbidity, fragmentation, need for integration
- Access, quality, sustainability

Epidemiology, Burden of Disease & Disability

- 500,000,000 people suffer from mental disorders
- Nearly 1,000,000 commit suicide every year
- 14% of the global burden of disease
- 30-45% of the global burden of disability
- \$ Trillions lost in disability, productivity, yearly

UN General Assembly Agenda on NCDs

- UN General Assembly, NYC, September 2011
- NCDs 1st time in the history of the UN Agenda
- Mental disorders excluded
- Excluded also from the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs)
- No health without mental health

- Absenteeism, presenteeism, & unemployment
- \$16 trillion loss in earnings & productivity
- 30-45% burden of disability
- 14% of the global burden of disease
- Premature deaths by 20 years
- 50% of illnesses present by age 14
- 75% of illnesses present by age 24
