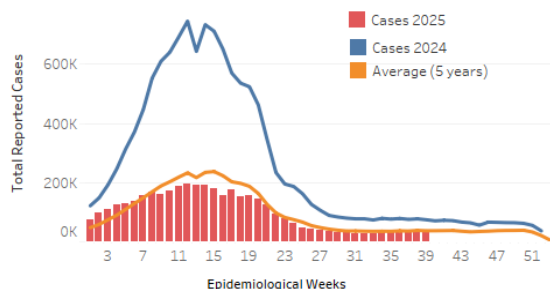


Report on the epidemiological situation of dengue in the Americas

As of epidemiological week 39, 2025. Update: Oct 17 2025 10:31AM (GTM-5)

In the epidemiological week (EW) 39 of 2025, a total of 3,931,323 suspected cases of dengue were reported, resulting in a cumulative incidence of 387 cases per 100,000 population. This represents a decrease of 68% compared to the same period in 2024 and 10% compared to the average of the last 5 years. Figure 1 shows the trend of suspected dengue cases as of EW 39.

Out of the 3,931,323 reported dengue cases in the Region, 1,558,127 cases (39%) were laboratory-confirmed, and 6,500 (0.2%) were classified as severe dengue. A total of 1,972 fatalities have been recorded, resulting in a case fatality rate (CFR) of 0.050%.

17 countries and territories within the region reported dengue cases in epidemiological week (EW) 39, accounting for 31,045 new suspected cases. Of these, 79 were classified as severe dengue (0.2%), and 2 deaths were reported, yielding a case fatality rate of 0.006%. The distribution of cases by country is detailed in Table 1.

Analysis by subregion

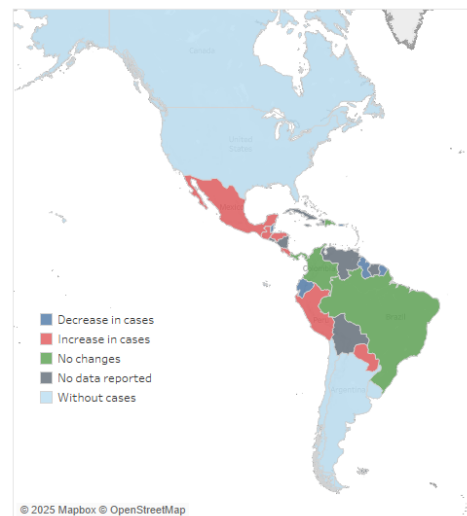
Central America and Mexico Sub-region. A total of 6,733 new suspected dengue cases were registered in EW 39. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 77% compared to the same week in 2024 and 41% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 3). The cases reported this week by Guatemala represent an increase of 26%, Mexico of 25%, Costa Rica of 25%, Honduras of 11% compared to the previous four epidemiological weeks (Figure 2).

Caribbean Sub-region. 73 new suspected dengue cases were registered in EW 39. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 47% compared to the same week in 2024 and 31% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 4).

Andean Sub-region. In EW 39, 2,220 new suspected dengue cases were registered. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 63% compared to the same week in 2024 and 24% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 5). The cases reported this week by Peru represent an increase of 34% compared to the previous four epidemiological weeks (Figure 2).

Southern Cone Sub-region. 22,019 new suspected dengue cases were reported in EW 39. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 68% compared to the same week in 2024 and 5% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 6). The cases reported this week by Paraguay represent an increase of 13% compared to the previous four epidemiological weeks (Figure 2).
