Hurricane Melissa (Category 5) formed on October 21, 2025, and made landfall in **Jamaica on** 

October 28. becoming one of the most intense storms in the Caribbean in decades. It severely impacted Jamaica, Haiti, Cuba, and the Dominican Republic



#### **Leaving behind:**

- Damaged hospitals and health centers with limited medical care services
- Disrupted basic services
- Isolated and displaced communities
- Increased risk of vector-borne and acute diarrheal diseases following the hurricane

## Regional logistics to save lives



From the PAHO's Strategic Reserve Center for Emergencies in Panama, essential medical supplies were immediately airlifted to affected areas.

# **Shipment from PAHO's Strategic Reserve Center for Emergencies in Panama**

**Essential medical kits** (Interagency Emergency Health Kit – IEHK, Noncommunicable Disease Kit – NCDK, and Hurricane Kits) to restore immediate care in response to the surge demand for medical services.



**Electric generators** to enable the continued operation of health facilities and medical equipment affected by the storm.

**Surgical kits** (TESK Trauma and **Emergency Surgery** Kits) to support urgent surgical procedures and clinical diagnosis of medical conditions.



Medical backpacks with supplies for first responders and primary health care services in the field.



Mosquito nets and water tanks to prevent vector-borne diseases and ensure access to safe water.



**Personal** protective equipment (PPE) to safeguard frontline and laboratory health personnel.

These efforts were made possible by countries' commitment to strategic prepositioning and

logistics systems that ensure supplies are dispatched, transported, received, and delivered to people affected by the emergency.

## Timeline of shipments

#### PRE-IMPACT PREPAREDNESS



- Emergency kits (IEHK) distributed to Choscal Hospital, Chapi Hospital, and Bethanie Hospital in the Ouest Department, in cooperation with PROMESS and the PAHO Country Office in Haiti.
- Trauma kits and hurricane kits with the capacity to serve approximately 11,100 people.
- Basic medical equipment: stethoscopes, thermometers, oximeters, and rapid diagnostic backpacks.



- 45 boxes (1 metric ton) airlifted to PROMESS, Haiti's central warehouse for essential medicines.
- Hurricane kits (3,000 patients for 30 days).



20 emergency medical backpacks with primary health care equipment (stethoscopes, oximeters, thermometers).





- **IEHK kits** (5,000 people for 3 months).
- **TESK kits** (100 surgical interventions), medical backpacks, generators, and surgical equipment.
- 6 pallets (2.6 t) delivered in Havana.





In coordination with the Royal **Netherlands Navy,** backpacks for first responders, deployment bags, water testing kits, and other complementary supplies were delivered, including PAHO blue vests for ground operations visibility, and logistical support materials.
