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## **RESOLUTIONS OF THE 52<sup>nd</sup> COSALFA**

**RESOLUTION I****PREVENTION AND PREPAREDNESS FOR FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE EMERGENCIES  
IN THE CARIBBEAN REGION****The 52<sup>nd</sup> Ordinary Meeting of COSALFA,****Whereas:**

- That the Co-operative Republic of Guyana constitutes a strategic nexus between South America and the Caribbean countries;
- That the Caribbean subregion presents distinct geographical, epidemiological, and logistical characteristics that call for differentiated approaches to prevention and response to animal health emergencies;
- The need to strengthen prevention and preparedness capacities in Caribbean countries as an essential component of regional sanitary protection;
- Those Caribbean countries, in coordination with regional bodies such as the Caribbean Animal Health and Food Safety Agency (CAHFSA) and the Caribbean Community (CARICOM), have identified the need to strengthen and harmonize their laboratory diagnostic and risk analysis capacities;

**It is resolved:**

1. Request PANAFTOSA/PAHO to promote technical cooperation between South American and Caribbean countries, fostering the exchange of experiences, best practices, and lessons learned in the prevention of and preparedness for foot-and-mouth disease emergencies, considering the diverse epidemiological contexts of the Region;
2. Urge PANAFTOSA/PAHO to support Caribbean countries, in coordination with subregional organizations, in strengthening their laboratory diagnostic and risk analysis capacities through regional technical cooperation initiatives.

**RESOLUTION II****HEMISPHERIC PROGRAM FOR THE ERADICATION OF FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (PHEFA)****ACTION PLAN 2026–2030****The 52<sup>nd</sup> Ordinary Meeting of COSALFA,****Whereas:**

- The results achieved in the implementation of the 2021–2025 Action Plan, as well as the lessons learned;
- The new 2026–2030 Action Plan, approved by the Hemispheric Committee for the Eradication of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (COHEFA) in December 2025, which establishes strategic priorities, including addressing countries with persistent challenges, strengthening emergency preparedness, and advancing regional integration;
- The recognized importance of promoting awareness and ensuring effective implementation of the 2026–2030 Action Plan at both the strategic level, with ministerial authorities, and the operational level, with livestock producers, to guarantee access to clear and transparent technical information;
- The importance of formal mechanisms to facilitate joint and cross-border actions aimed at advancing the eradication of foot-and-mouth disease in Venezuela;
- That since 2022, the Ministry of Popular Power for Productive Agriculture and Lands (MPPAPT) of Venezuela has been evaluating a proposal for a Technical Cooperation Agreement with PANAFTOSA/PAHO;
- That, following the technical mission conducted by PANAFTOSA/PAHO to Venezuela from 6 to 10 April 2026, the country approved the PROFA 2026–2030 Operational Plan, which was technically validated by MPPAPT-INSAI and FUNVESSA, with the support of the international organization.

**It is resolved:**

1. Recognize and commend the countries of the Region for the progress achieved under the 2021–2025 Action Plan of the Hemispheric Program for the Eradication of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (PHEFA);

2. Express appreciation to PANAFTOSA/PAHO for the preparation of the 2026–2030 Action Plan, as approved by the Hemispheric Committee for the Eradication of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (COHEFA), which serves as the regional forum for defining strategies and coordinating progress toward eradication;
3. Urge both the public and private sectors of COSALFA Member States to actively disseminate the PHEFA 2026–2030 among key national stakeholders and to incorporate it into their respective national policies and programmes;
4. Request PANAFTOSA/PAHO to support the dissemination of the new Action Plan to ministerial authorities and to conduct periodic monitoring of its indicators at the regional level, reporting on progress at COSALFA meetings;
5. Encourage Brazil, Colombia, and Venezuela to renew formal mechanisms of technical cooperation to advance coordinated actions;
6. Call upon the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela to approve the proposed Technical Cooperation Agreement with PANAFTOSA/PAHO;
7. Urge the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela to initiate, without delay, the implementation of the PROFA 2026–2030 Operational Plan, with the technical support of PANAFTOSA/PAHO and in accordance with the established timeline.

## RESOLUTION III

### STRATEGY FOR THE PREVENTION, PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE TO FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE EMERGENCIES

#### The 52<sup>nd</sup> Ordinary Meeting of COSALFA,

##### Whereas:

- The establishment of the FMD Regional Antigen Bank (BANVACO) in August 2025, which constitutes a strategic instrument to ensure the timely availability of antigens and vaccines against foot-and-mouth disease in emergency situations;
- That risk analysis studies are essential to identify vulnerabilities, prioritize interventions, and support technical and policy decision-making at national and regional levels;
- The importance of ensuring that accurate, science-based information reaches all stakeholders involved in the prevention and surveillance of foot-and-mouth disease, particularly rural producers.

##### It is resolved:

1. Congratulations on the establishment of BANVACO and the progress achieved in its implementation;
2. Request PANAFTOSA/PAHO to continue coordinating and strengthening BANVACO, promoting its dissemination and expansion in membership, including the participation of countries from the Caribbean, Mesoamerica, and North America;
3. Request PANAFTOSA/PAHO to continue supporting countries in the Region in the training and implementation of tools and methodologies for risk assessment and risk communication, tailored to relevant stakeholders;
4. Recommend that Member States develop and strengthen their national capacities in risk assessment and communication to support decision-making related to the prevention, detection, and response to the potential introduction of foot-and-mouth disease.

## RESOLUTION IV

### COSALFA: CONSOLIDATION AND REGIONAL PROJECTION

#### The 52<sup>nd</sup> Ordinary Meeting of COSALFA,

##### Whereas:

- That COSALFA has served as a key regional governance mechanism, enabling South America region to achieve substantial progress in the eradication of foot-and-mouth disease, with more than 99% of herds recognized as FMD disease-free;
- That the countries of the Caribbean and Mesoamerica have remained free of foot-and-mouth disease for several decades;
- That the post-eradication context presents new challenges, and that the countries of the Caribbean and Mesoamerica face circumstances comparable to those of South America in terms of exposure to global risks;
- That it is important to strengthen the participation of other stakeholders in the livestock sector, including private veterinary practitioners and academia, in regional forums related to foot-and-mouth disease.

##### It is resolved:

1. Request PANAFTOSA/PAHO, in coordination with Member States, to develop a proposal to update the COSALFA model, including a review of its regional scope, participation, periodicity, and meeting format, for consideration at COSALFA 53.

## RESOLUTION V

### APPROVAL OF THE PHEFA BIENNIAL PLAN 2026–2027

**The 52<sup>nd</sup> Ordinary Meeting of COSALFA,**

**Whereas:**

- That the Hemispheric Program for the Eradication of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (PHEFA) constitutes the regional strategic framework for coordinating actions aimed at the eradication of the disease and the sustainability of the sanitary status in the Region;
- That PANAFTOSA/PAHO, in its capacity as ex officio Secretariat of COSALFA, has submitted the 2026–2027 Biennial Plan for consideration by Member States.

**It is resolved:**

1. Approve the PHEFA 2026–2027 Biennial Plan, recognizing it as an operational framework for the implementation of regional actions within the context of the 2026–2030 Action Plan;
2. Request PANAFTOSA-PAHO to provide technical cooperation to Member States for the implementation of the Biennial Plan;
3. Urge COSALFA Member States, both public and private sectors, to contribute to the mobilization of the resources necessary for the effective implementation of the 2026–2027 Biennial Plan.

**RESOLUTION VI****RECOGNITION OF THE DIRECTOR OF PANAFTOSA-PAHO****The 52<sup>nd</sup> Ordinary Meeting of COSALFA,****Whereas:**

- The appointment of the new Director of PANAFTOSA/PAHO at a decisive moment for the Region, characterized by the consolidation of achievements in the eradication of foot-and-mouth disease and the transition toward a scenario of sustainable sanitary status;
- That Dr. Manuel José Sánchez Vázquez brings a solid background in international technical cooperation, as well as extensive prior experience within PANAFTOSA/PAHO, constituting a valuable asset for institutional leadership in this new phase;
- That strengthening regional cooperation, risk-based surveillance, and preparedness for health emergencies requires strong and articulating technical leadership at the regional level.

**It is resolved:**

1. Welcome and express its recognition to Dr. Manuel José Sánchez Vázquez on his appointment as Director of PANAFTOSA/PAHO;
2. Express its confidence that, under his leadership, PANAFTOSA/PAHO will continue to effectively support Member States in consolidating the eradication of foot-and-mouth disease and in strengthening capacities for prevention, surveillance, and response.
