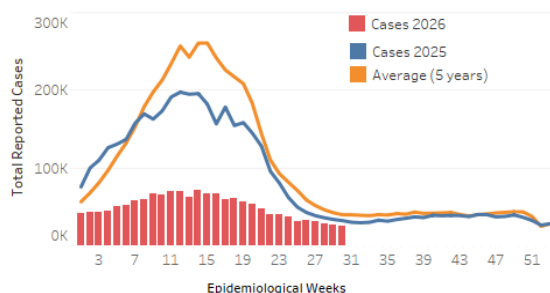


Report on the epidemiological situation of dengue in endemic countries of the Americas

As of epidemiological week 30, 2026. Update: Aug 24 2026 2:28PM (GTM-5)

In the epidemiological week (EW) 30 of 2026, a total of 1,499,496 suspected cases of dengue were reported, resulting in a cumulative incidence of 145 cases per 100,000 population. This represents a decrease of 59% compared to the same period in 2025 and 66% compared to the average of the last 5 years. Figure 1 shows the trend of suspected dengue cases as of EW 30.

Out of the 1,499,496 reported dengue cases in the Region, 455,337 cases (30%) were laboratory-confirmed, and 2,877 (0.2%) were classified as severe dengue. A total of 458 deaths have been recorded, resulting in a case fatality rate (CFR) of 0.031%.

17 countries and territories within the region reported dengue cases in epidemiological week (EW) 30, accounting for 24,796 new suspected cases. Of these, 46 were classified as severe dengue (0.2%), and 4 deaths reported, yielding a case fatality rate of 0.016%. The distribution of cases by country is detailed in Table 1.

Analysis by subregion

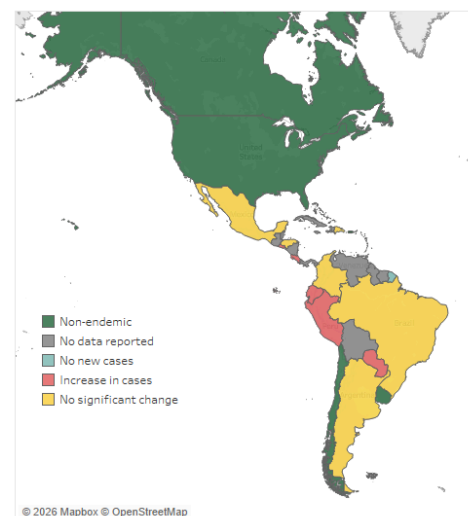
Central America and Mexico Sub-region. A total of 2,661 new suspected dengue cases were registered in EW 30. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 42% compared to the same week in 2025 and 55% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 3). The cases reported this week by Costa Rica represent an increase of 37%, El Salvador of 32% compared to the previous four epidemiological weeks (Figure 2).

Caribbean Sub-region. 43 new suspected dengue cases were registered in EW 30. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 72% compared to the same week in 2025 and 70% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 4).

Andean Sub-region. In EW 30, 5,733 new suspected dengue cases were registered. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 11% compared to the same week in 2025 and 27% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 5). The cases reported this week by Perú represent an increase of 16%, Ecuador of 14% compared to the previous four epidemiological weeks (Figure 2).

Southern Cone Sub-region. 16,359 new suspected dengue cases were reported in EW 30. As of this week, the subregion exhibits an decrease of 64% compared to the same week in 2025 and 69% compared to the average of the last five years (Figure 6). The cases reported this week by Paraguay represent an increase of 64% compared to the previous four epidemiological weeks (Figure 2).
