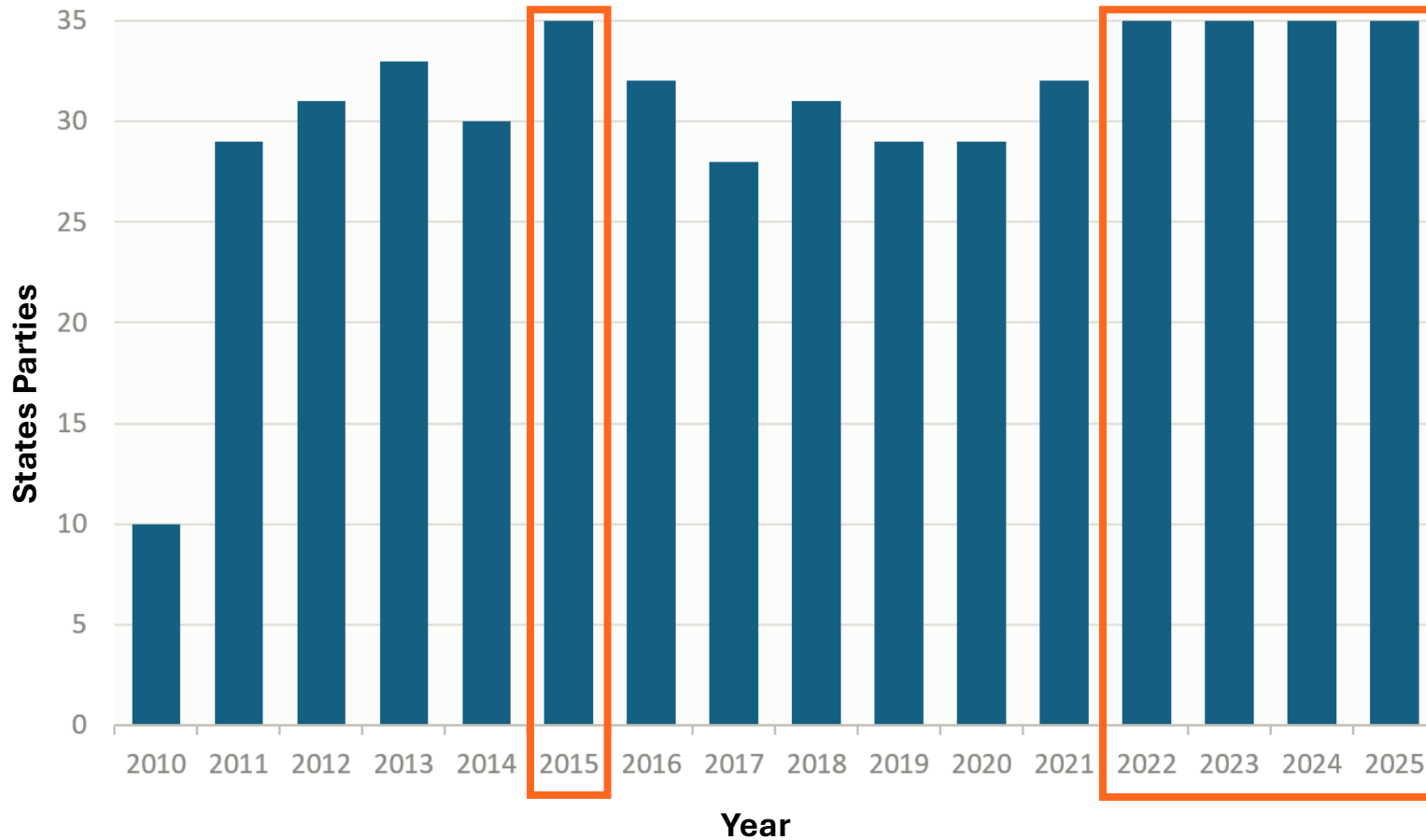

Introduction

1. This document reports on the application and implementation status of the International Health Regulations (IHR) and compliance therewith (1). It covers the period from 16 July 2025 to 15 July 2026, updating the information presented to the 178th Session of the Executive Committee of the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) in June 2026 (2) and complementing the information presented to the 79th World Health Assembly in May 2026 (3).
2. Pursuant to IHR provisions, this report discusses acute public health events, States Parties' core capacities, administrative requirements, and governance. It also highlights issues requiring concerted action by States Parties in the Region of the Americas and by the Pan American Sanitary Bureau (PASB or the Bureau) to enhance future application and implementation of the IHR and compliance with them.

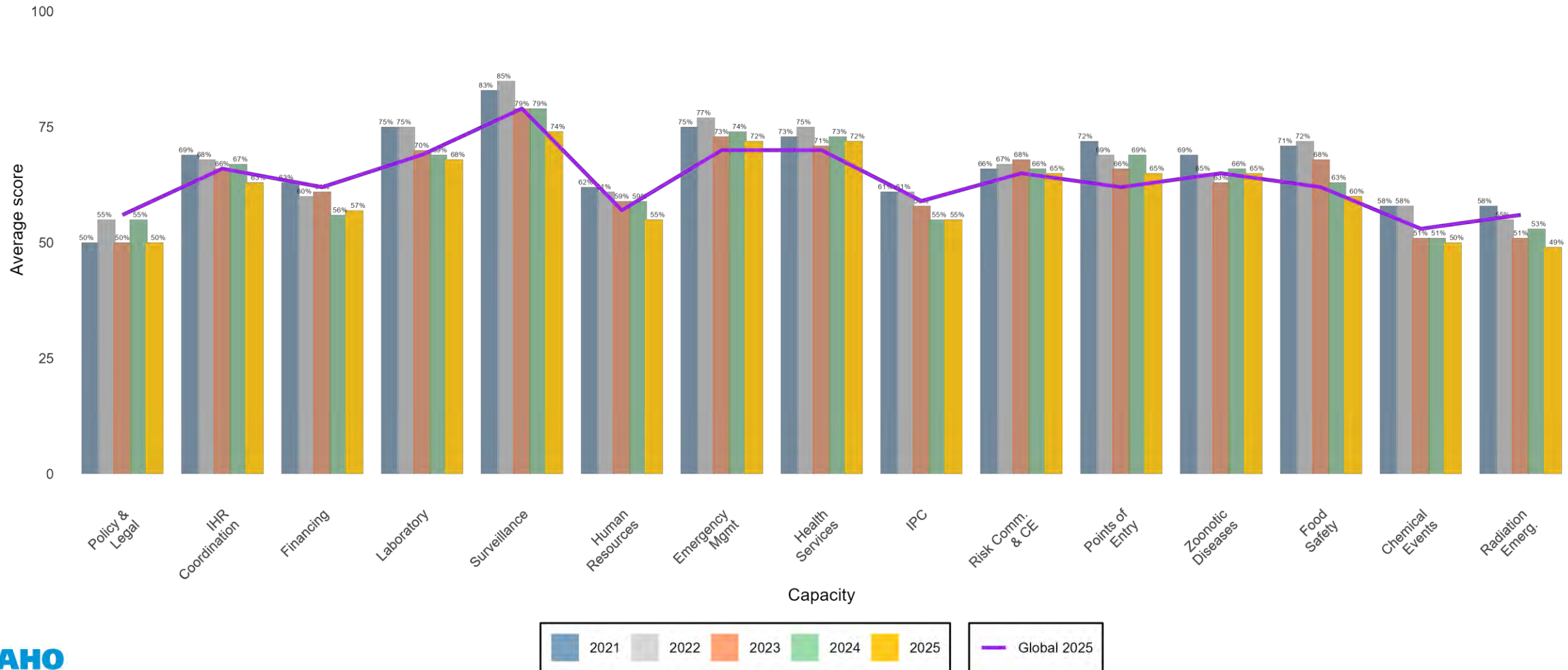

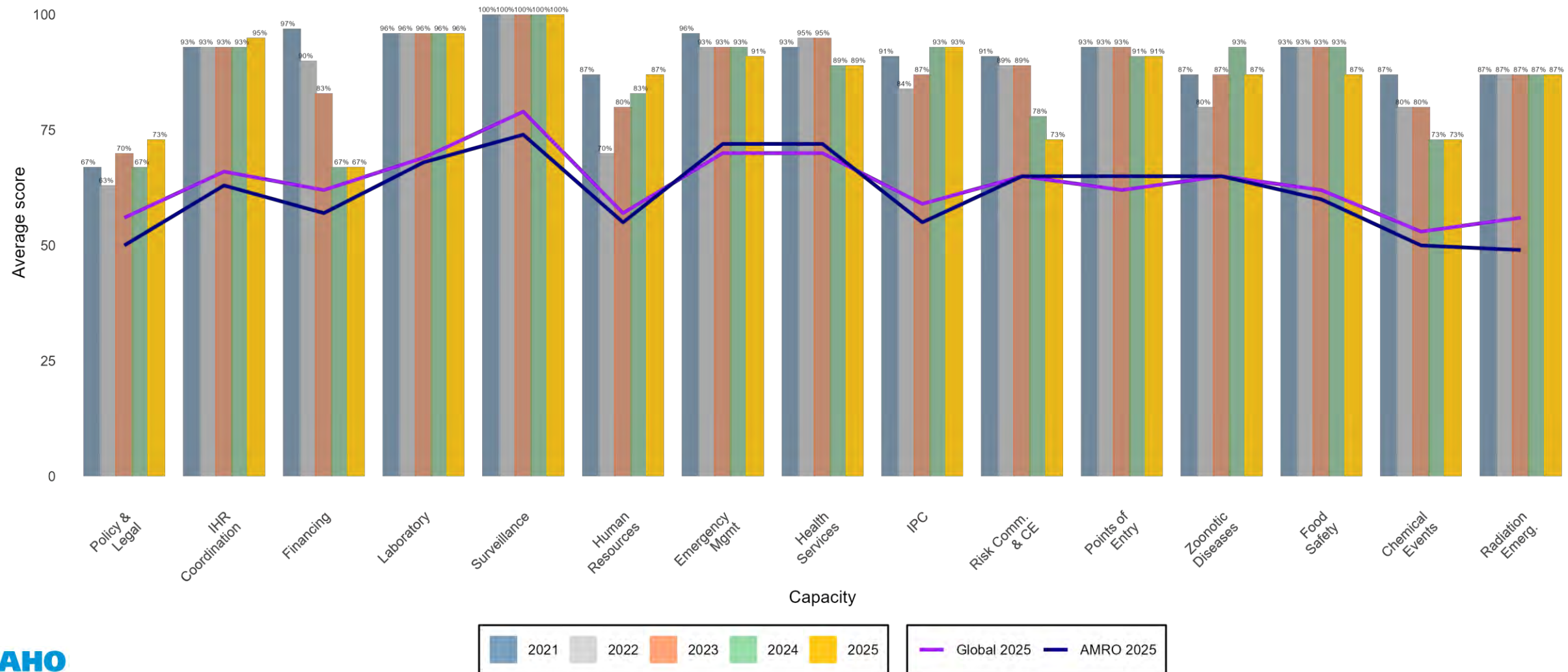

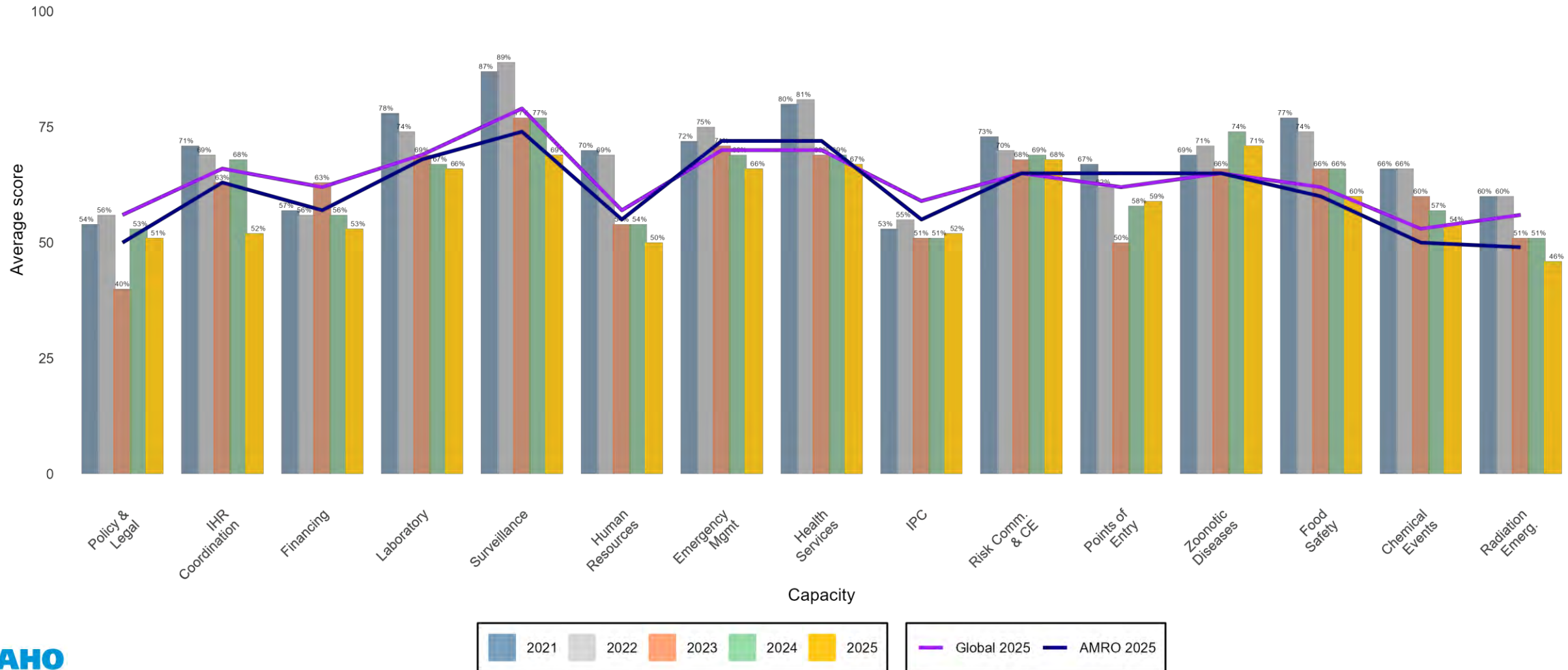

SPAR Capacities 2021-2025: North America subregion



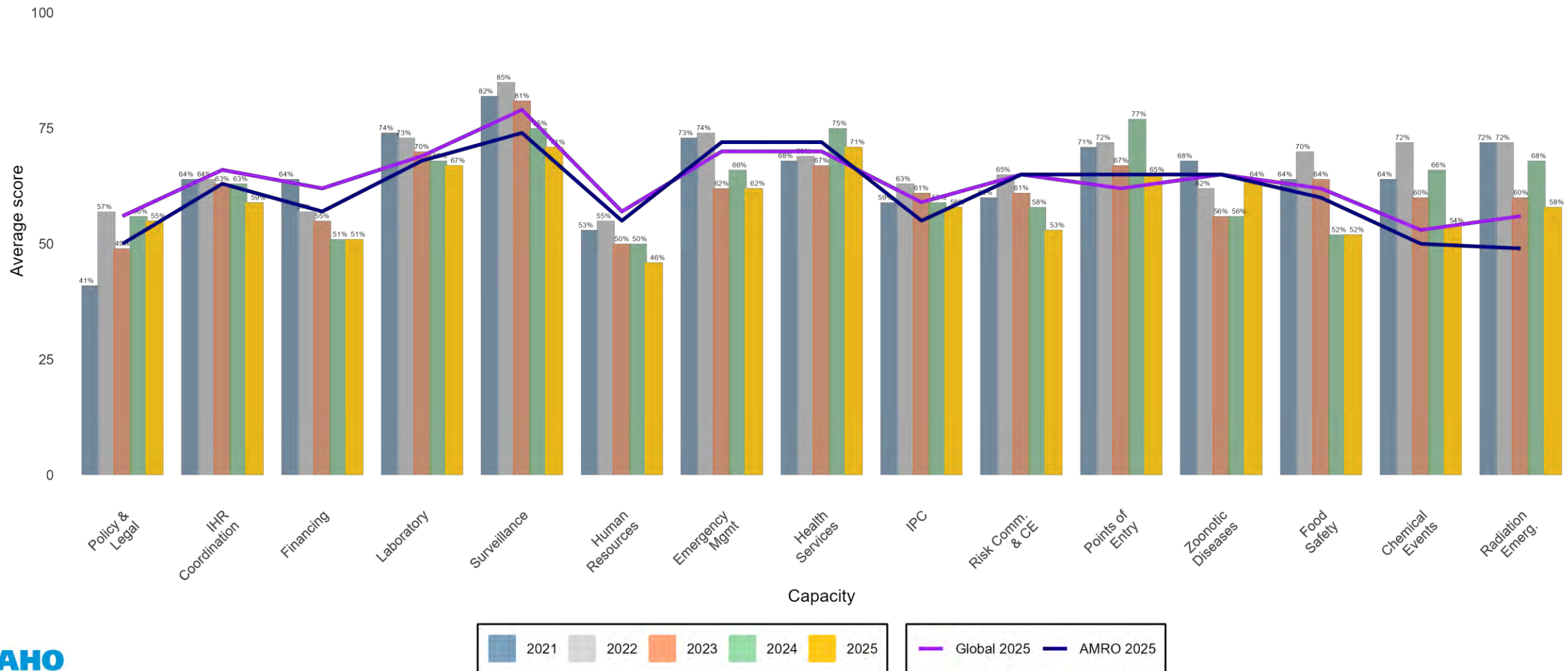

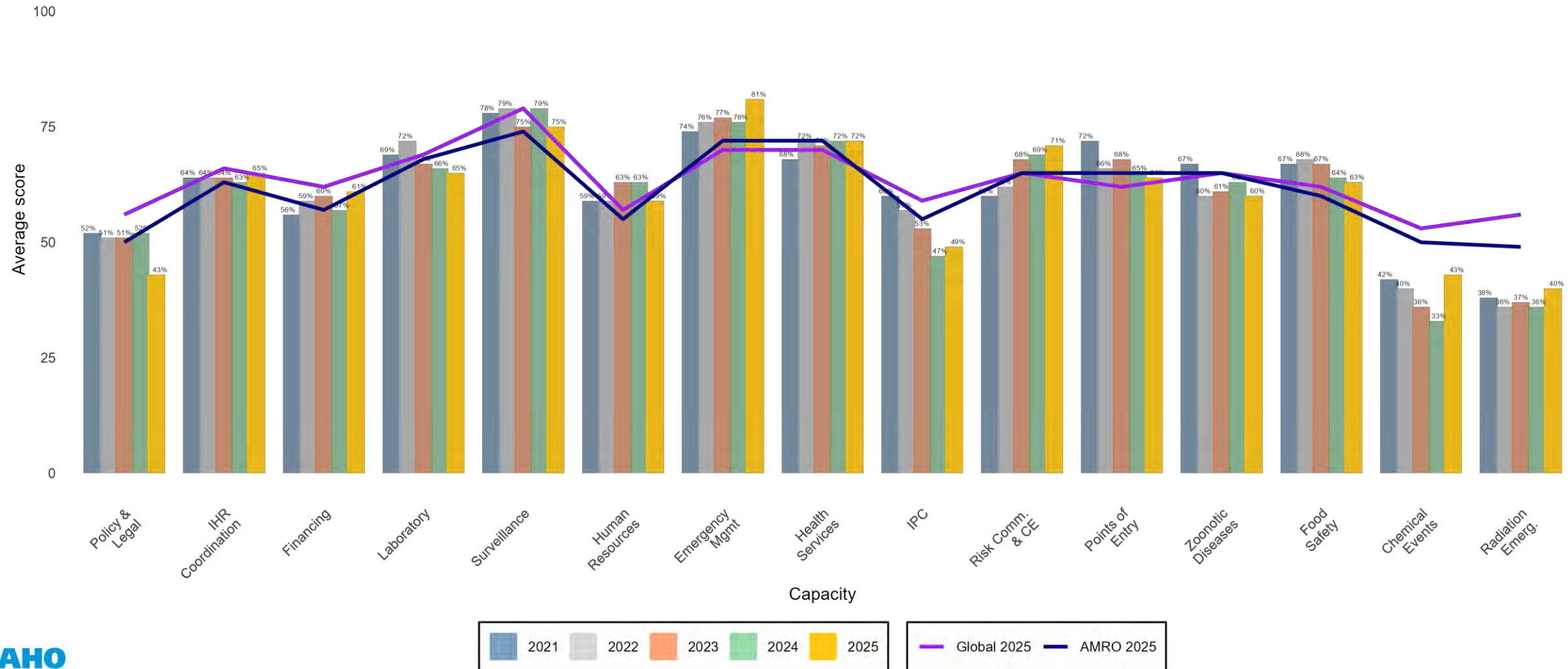

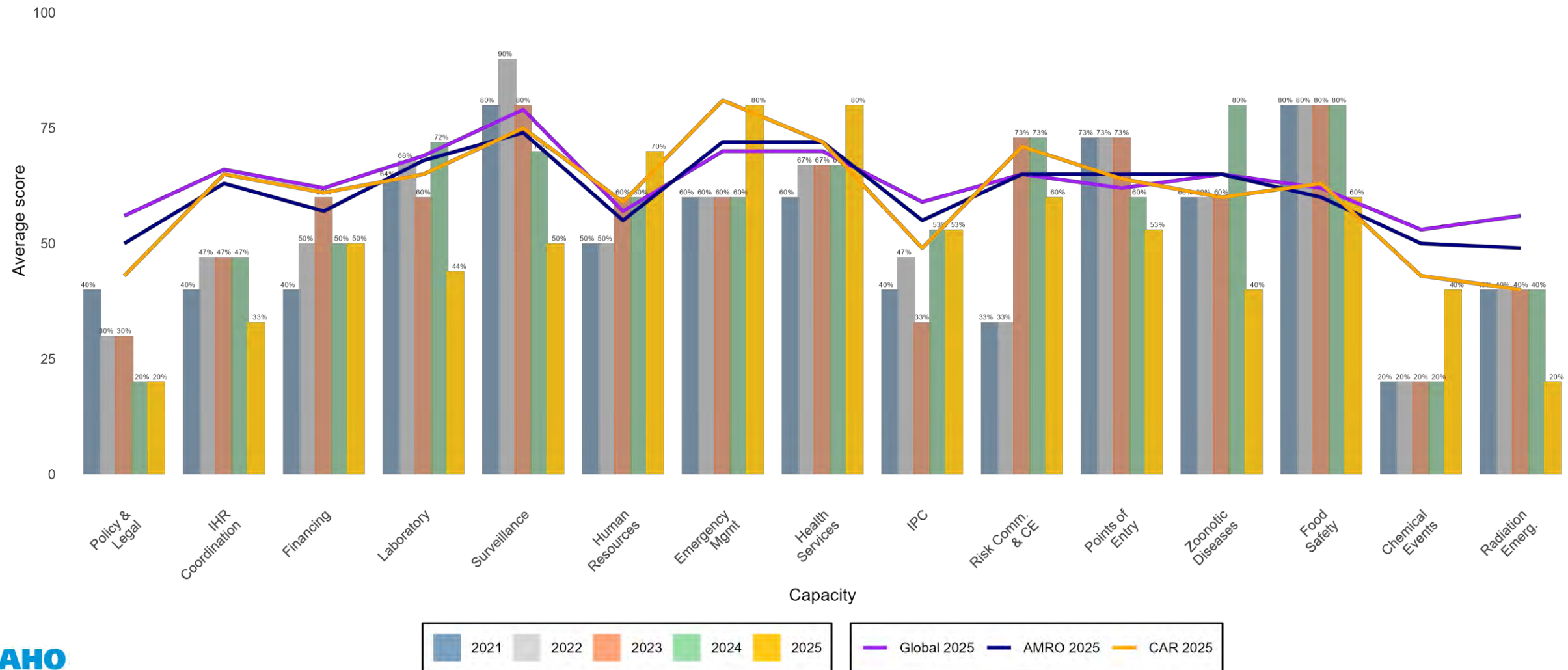

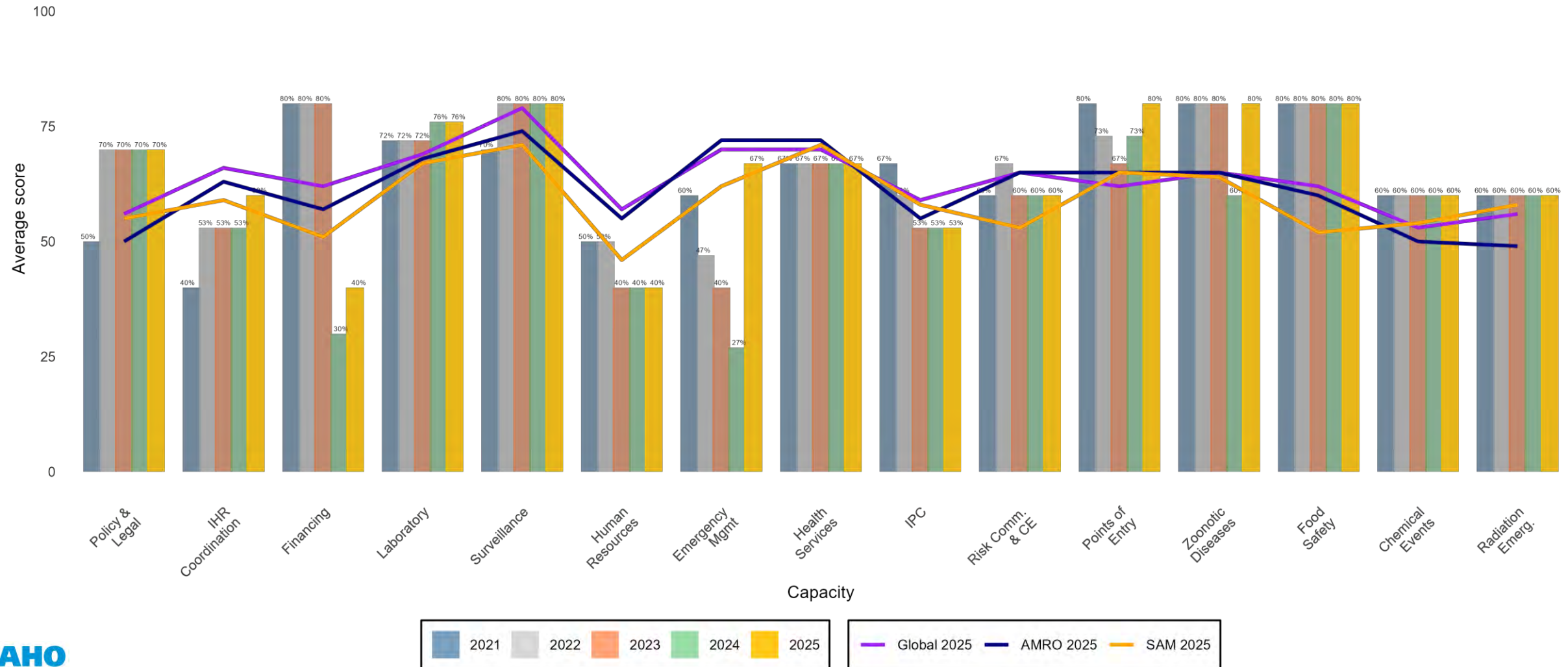

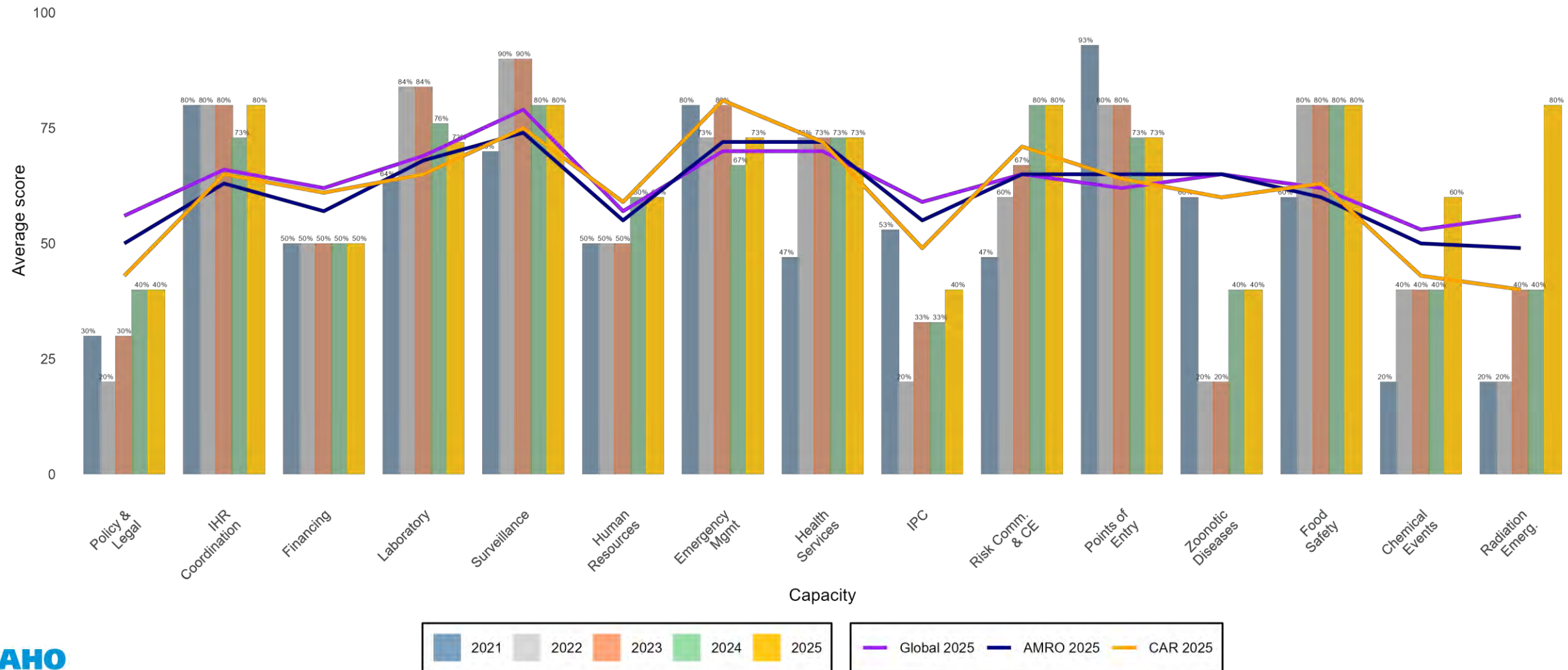

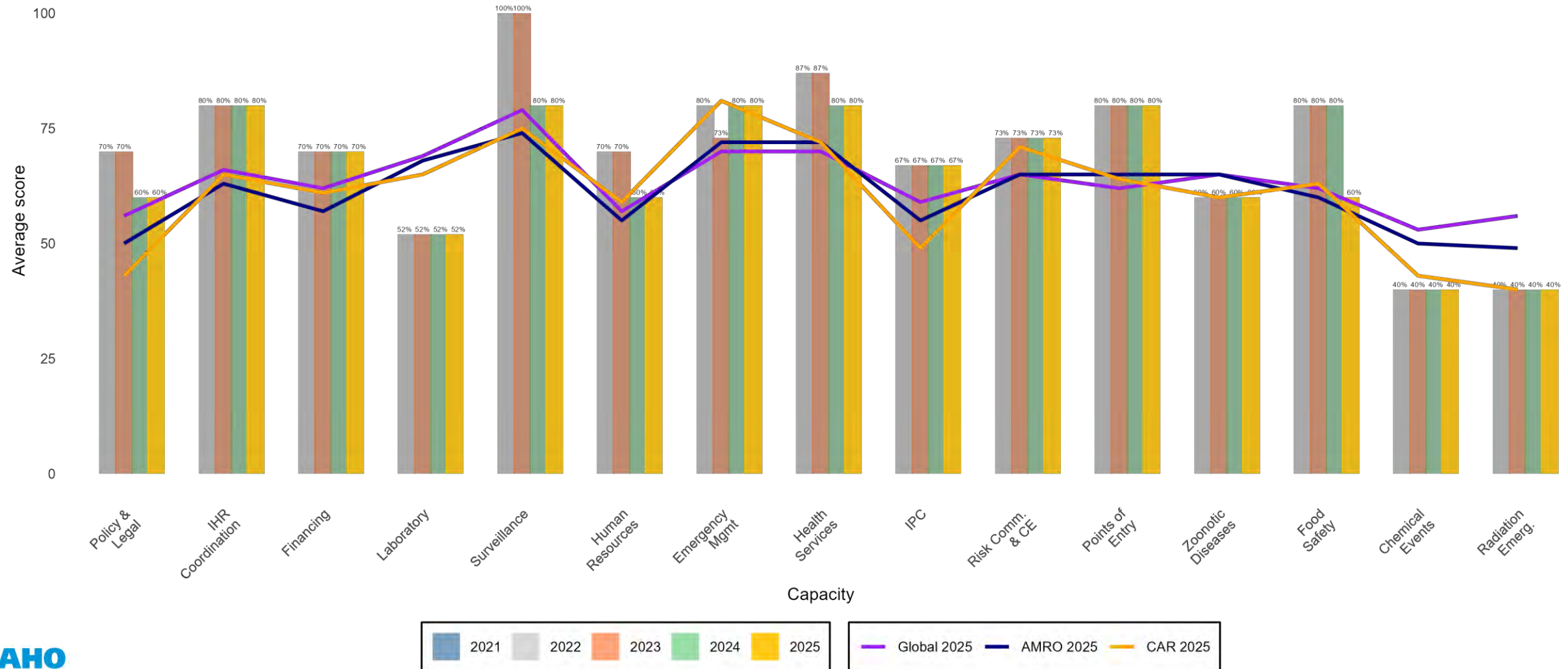

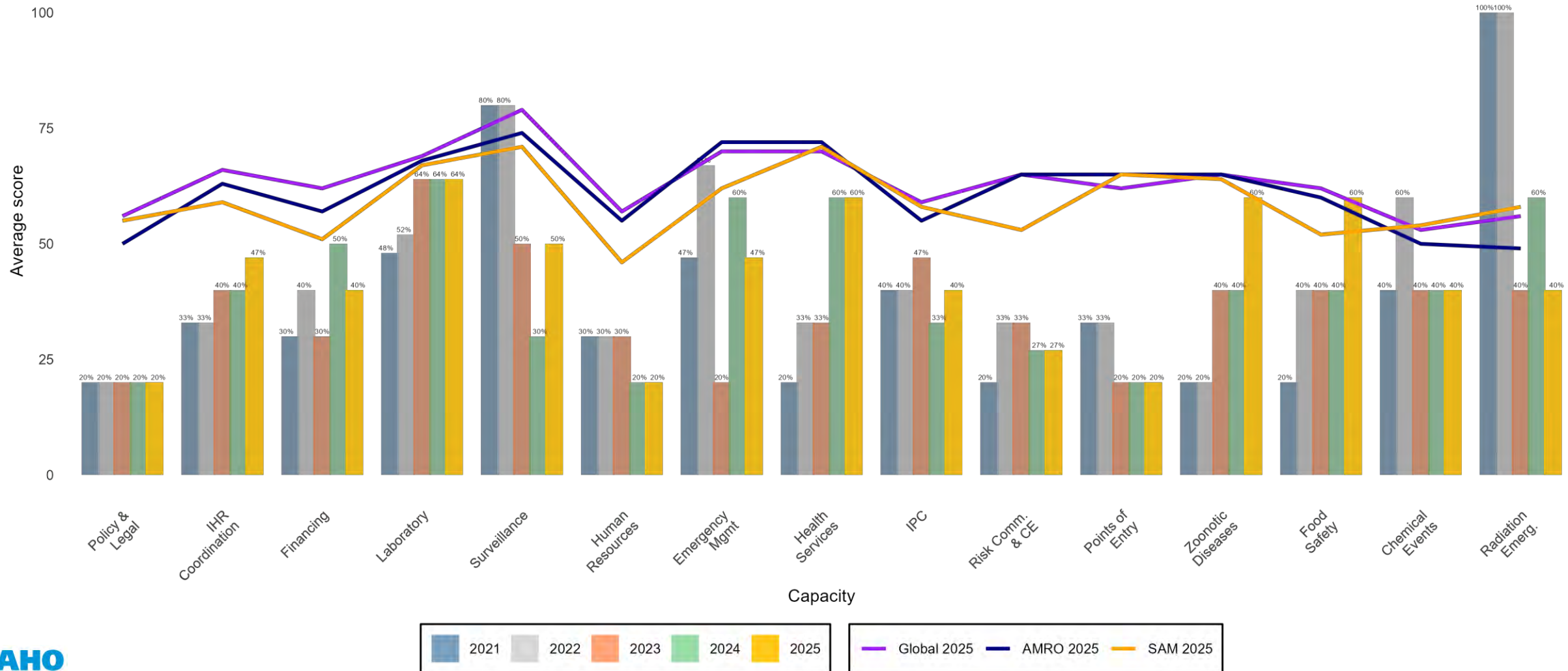

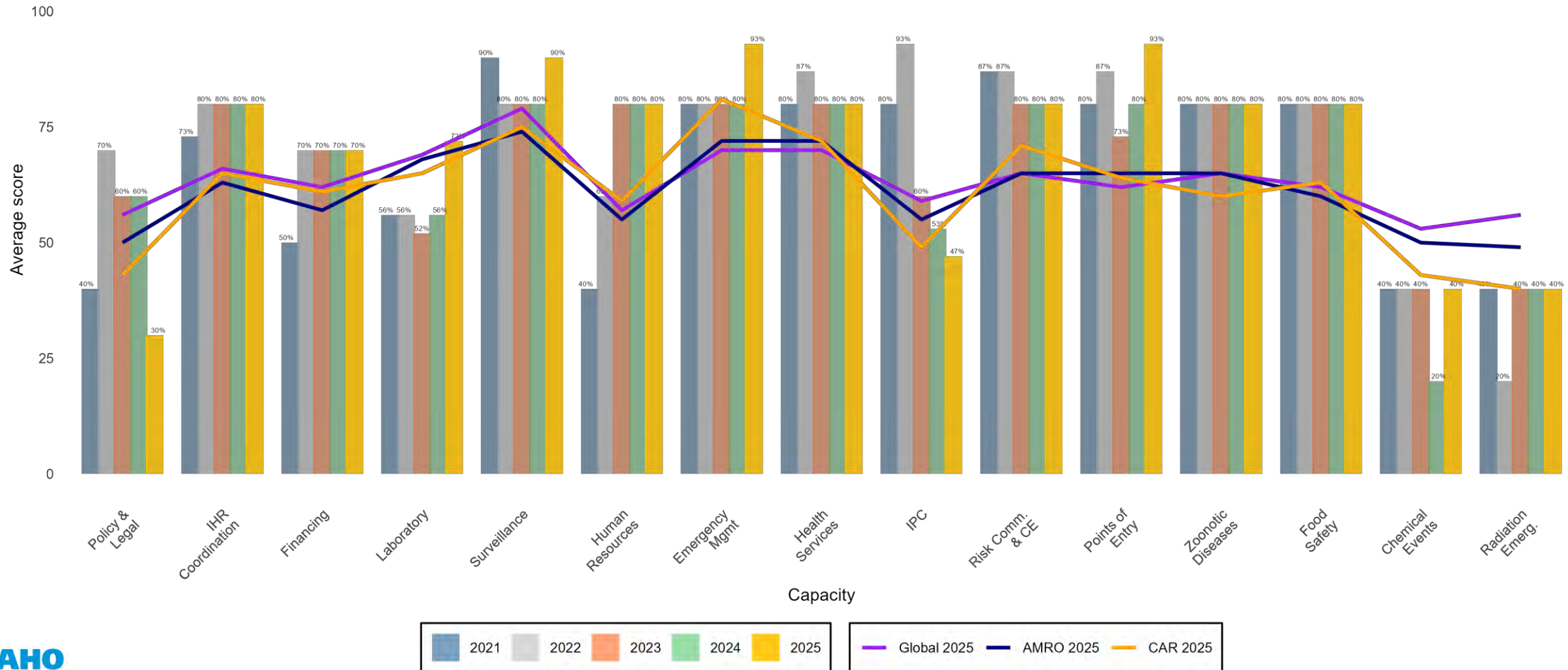

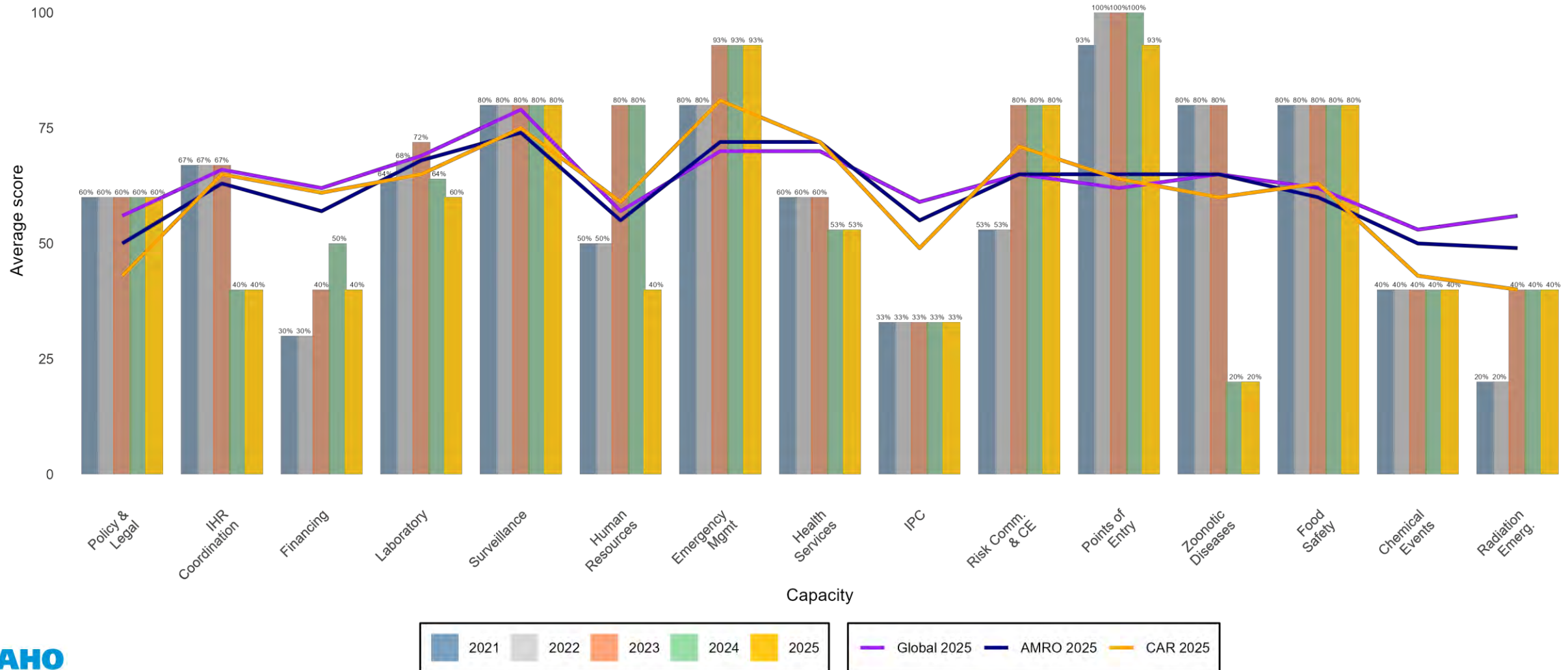

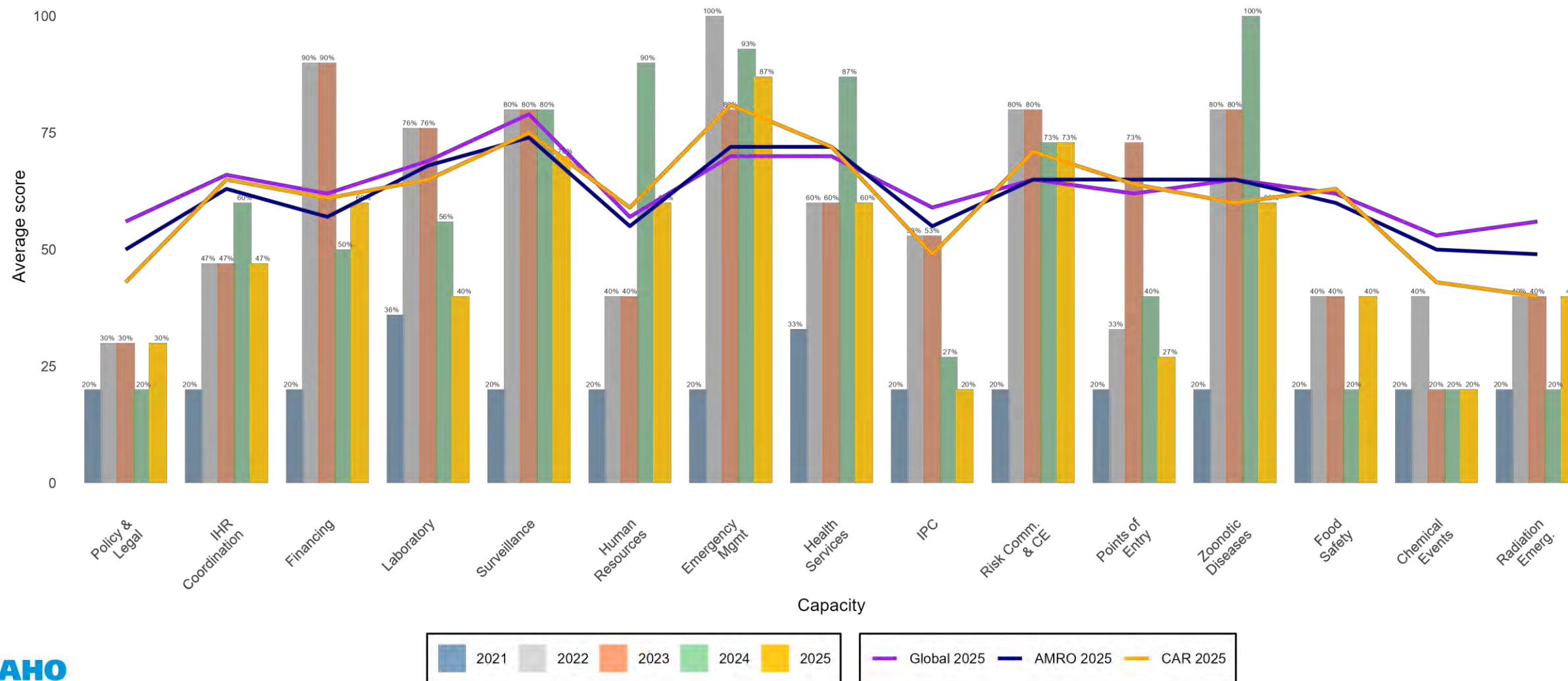

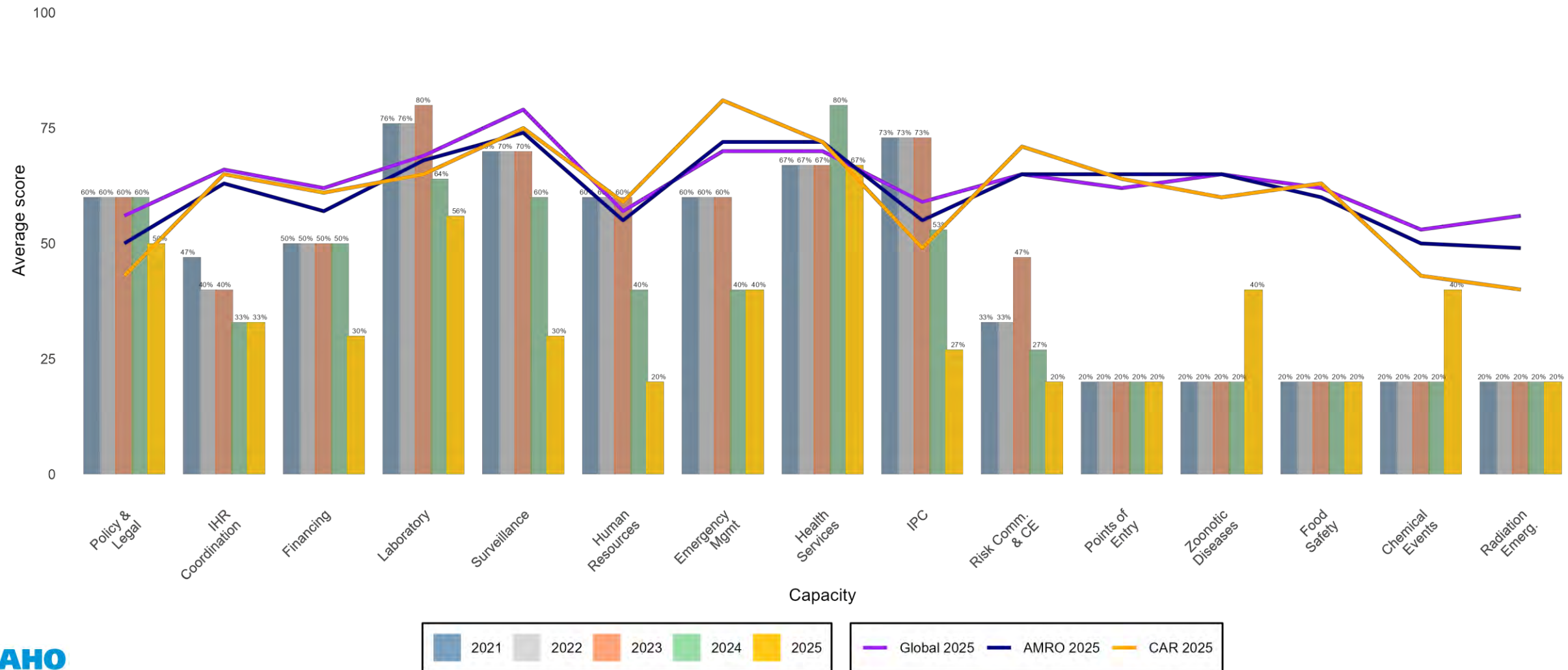

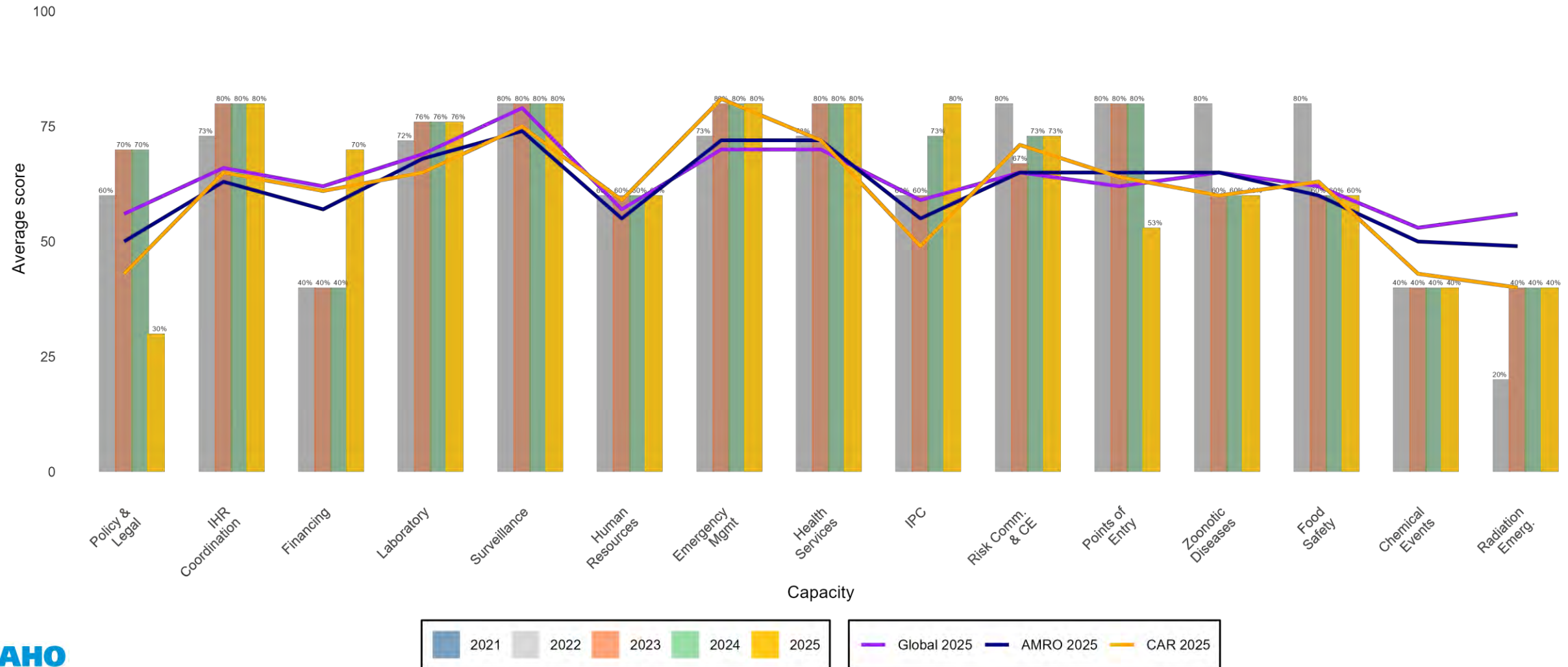

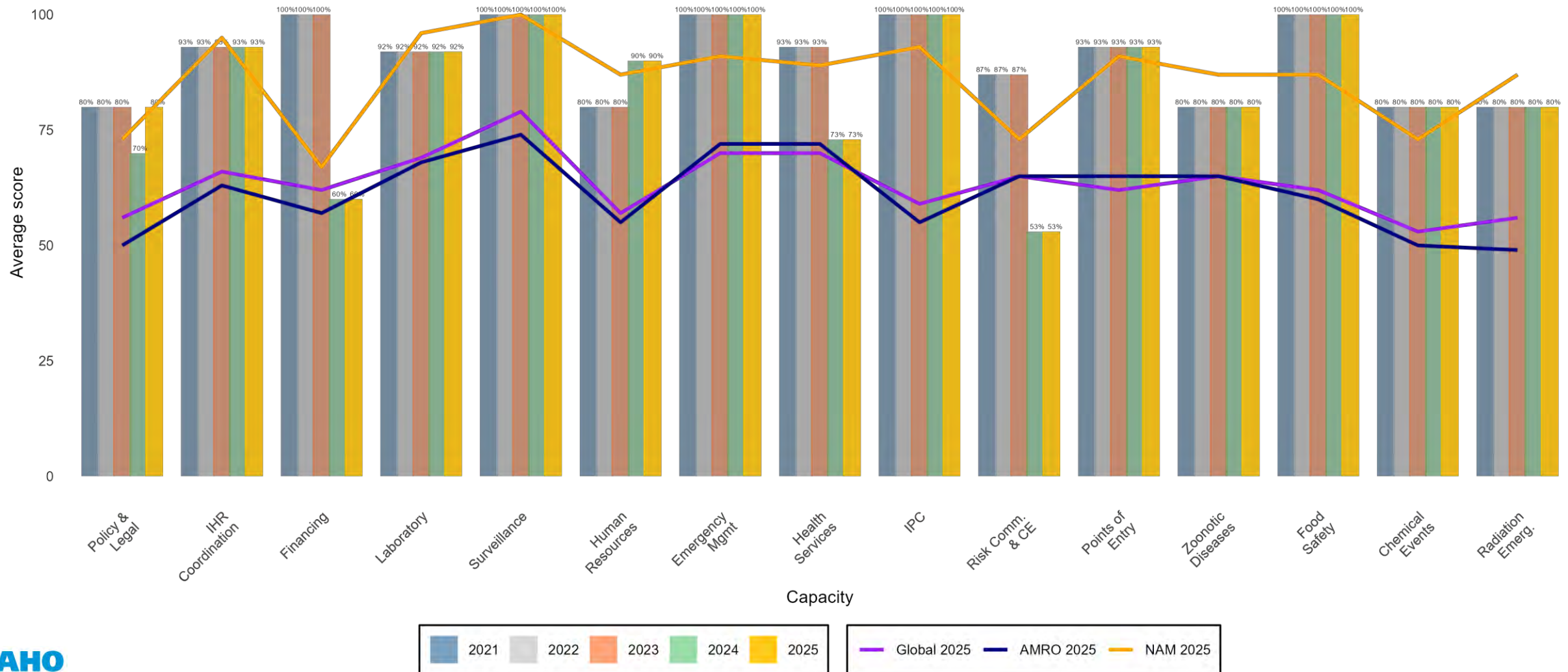

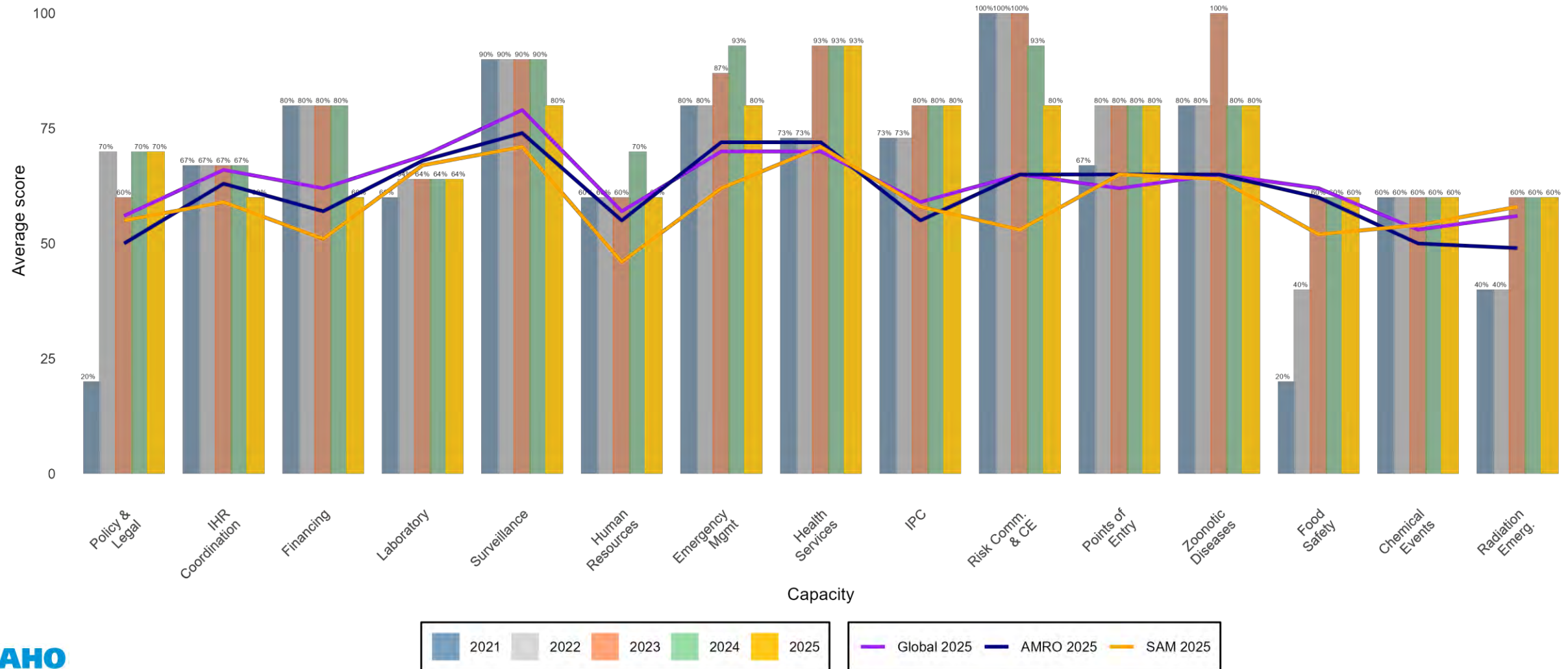

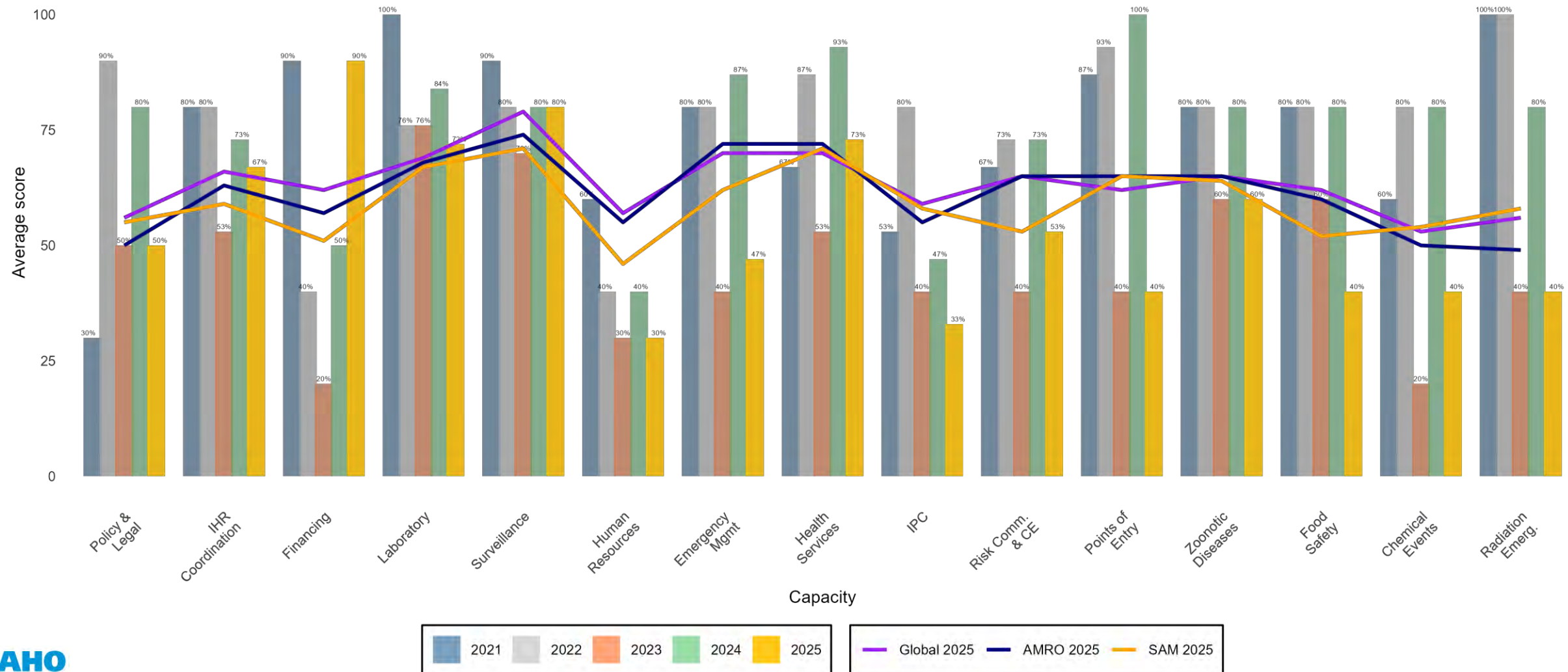
