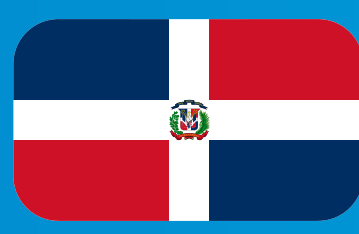
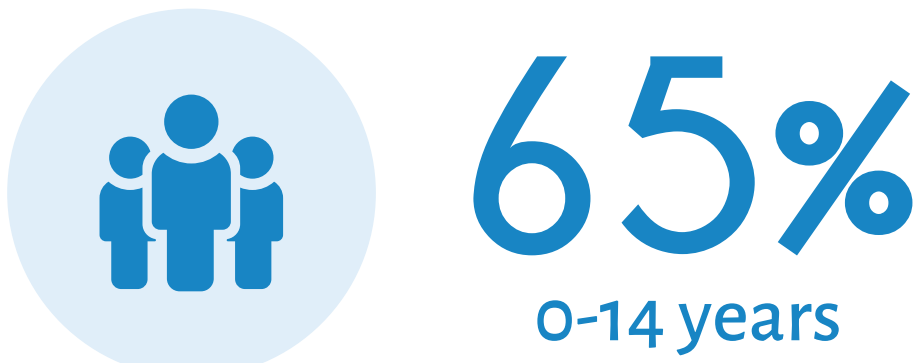

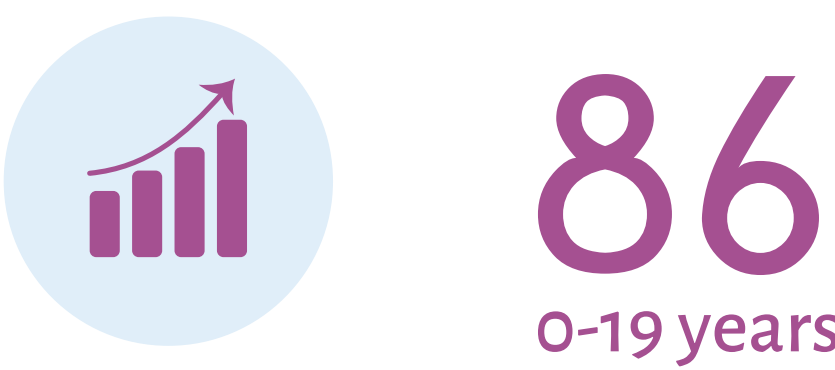
OVERALL SURVIVAL (5 YEARS)



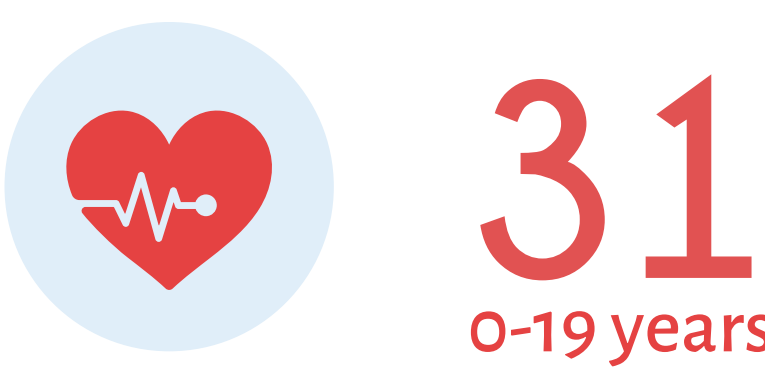
NEW CASES PER YEAR
