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WHO Global Conference on Noncommunicable Diseases Montevideo, Uruguay 18-20 October



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Conference Goal

To highlight the critical links between reducing premature deaths from NCDs, promoting mental health and well-being and enhancing policy coherence across areas that impact the governance, prevention, management and surveillance of NCDs.



Objectives

- To provide guidance to Member States on how to reach SDG target 3.4 by 2030 by influencing public policies in sectors beyond health and enhancing policy coherence
- To launch a set of new global initiatives which will help countries to accelerate their progress to date in reducing premature mortality from NCDs and fast track their efforts to attain SDG target 3.4
- To exchange national experiences in enhancing policy coherence to attain the nine voluntary global NCD targets for 2025
- To highlight the health sector as the key advocate for enhancing policy coherence for the attainment of SDG target 3.4



Conference Participation

- **5 Head of States:** Argentina, Chile, Paraguay, Uruguay and Zimbabwe.
- **30 Ministers,** including: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Columbia, Ecuador, Guyana, Panama, Paraguay, St Kitts & Nevis, Saint Lucia, Suriname, and Uruguay.
- **More than 400 participants:** from governments, UN agencies, and no-State-actors (NGOs, private sector, philanthropic foundations, and academic institutions)

- support implementation of WHO best buys.



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


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High-Level Segment

- Adoption of the **Montevideo Roadmap 2018-2030 on NCDs**



1. Reinvigorate political action
2. Enable health systems to respond more effectively to NCDs
3. Increase significantly the financing of national NCD responses and international cooperation
4. Increase efforts to engage sectors beyond health
5. Reinforce the role of non-state actors
6. Seek measures to address the negative impact of products and environmental factors harmful for health and strengthen the contribution and accountability of the private sector and other non-State actors
7. Continue relying on WHO's leadership and key role in the global response to NCDs
8. Act in unity



- 3** National Health Survey (e.g. PanAm STEPs)



Risk Factors:


- 5** Tobacco demand reduction measures
- 6** Alcohol demand reduction measures
- 7** Support for the health diet and breastfeeding
- 8** Measures to increase physical activity



NCDs plans and management:

- 4** NCD multisectoral and operational plans
- 9** Clinical guidelines to manage NCDs
- 10** Drug therapy and counselling to prevent CVD

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




